A term that I thought would never became a part of church life has so entered into the lexicon of today that it is driving me crazy. The term "social distancing" is one that I do not care if I ever hear it again.

Every part of church life and the life of a Christian is about relationship and fellowship. Gathering to share in praise and worship, the sharing of the Lord's Table, the care and comfort of those that are in need. Yet in the new normal of today we are told to stay away from each other, wash continually and especially after contact of anyone closer than six feet.

I feel we should be yelling at each other and have name tags that can be read from six feet away which say "unclean".

In some ways the church of today has made a great leap into the electronic age with all of the different ways in which the word of God is being presented today, but I also feel that we have lost about two thousand years of advancement in sharing the gospel. We have lost the personal affect of a personal God.

I know for me the daily devotion and the Sunday service I do on Face Book now does not feel the same as a person contact and seeing and feeling the reaction from the people.

I do pray that by June we will be able to get back to a personal contact system with church and Bible studies but only time will tell what we will be allowed to do and then how we are to do things.

#### Trustees Report...


Other than the decisions made during the special meeting of the Leadership Team last month, it's been pretty quiet in the Trustee world. It is time for the quarterly report of the Trustee's finances. Unless you've been living off the grid during the pandemic, you know the stock market has been very volatile over the last couple months. Overall there has been a pretty significant decline in our investments.


The following balances (rounded) are as of March 31:

- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) \$595,561 a decrease of \$89,857 from the last quarter We needed to transfer \$20,000 from this account for current expenses in February.
- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) Fire Insurance Fund \$332,650 we opened this account with \$450,000 of the initial proceeds from the insurance claim and since withdrew \$120,000 to pay for some of the clean-up/demolition.
- Prudential Investments \$530,537 a decrease of \$99,260 from the last quarter this is our 'in lieu of flood insurance' account.
- Prudential Investments The Radenbush Trust \$90,657 a decrease of \$2,231 from last quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$7,087 a decrease of \$1,226 from the last quarter.
- BYN Mellon The Butler Trust \$176,415 a decrease of \$38,657 which includes the quarterly disbursement of \$2,625 which helps with current expenses.


