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SEA SERVICE SUMMARY

Total your sea service in days and enter in the specific categories below. It is the policy of the Washington State Board of Pilotage Commissioners (Board) that one day of duty time equates to one day of sea service with no multiples or reductions based upon the type of industry or the watch and schedule a certain officer has to stand. One year of sea service equals 360 days of duty time on the vessel in the required capacity, excluding days off, sick leave, vacation and any other off-duty time. Applicants combining types of sea service listed below shall have a total of at least two years of the various service times, except that one day of service as master on cargo or tank vessels of at least 5,000 GRT or 10,000 GT (ITC) shall be credited as two days of service time for the purpose of calculating such combined service times. Documentary evidence, satisfactory to the Board, must be presented, certifying to the applicant's sea service as master, commanding officer or as a member of a professional pilots association. The documentation submitted shall be an itemization of the amount and nature of sea service signed by the appropriate representative of the pilot applicant's employer(s) or certificates of discharge documenting the sea-time. If the applicant is unable to produce such documentation, the applicant must obtain the Board's written approval specifying alternative documentation of equal reliability that will be acceptable to the Board.

(A) Cargo or tank vessels not less than 5,000 GRT or 10,000 GT (ITC) on Ocean or near coastal waters.

2021 MARINE PILOT EXAMINATION FEE SCHEDULE

On Monday April 5, 2021, the Washington State Board of Pilotage Commissioners (Board) will administer a written examination in Seattle, Washington to eligible applicants for the Grays Harbor and Puget Sound Pilotage Districts. Applicants who meet or exceed the cut score set by the Board on the written examination will qualify to take a simulator evaluation which will be administered beginning the week of April 12, 2021. Applicants who meet or exceed the cut score set by the Board on the written examination and simulator evaluation will be placed on a waiting list to be called into a training program as needed. Successful completion of a training program is required in order to be eligible for the issuance of a state pilot license for the applicable pilotage district. It is necessary to meet or exceed the Board-established cut score on the written examination to qualify to take the simulator evaluation. The number of applicants who qualify to take the simulator evaluation will be determined by the Board after the results of the written examination are available.

A separate fee is assessed for each step of the application, written examination, and simulator evaluation process:

(1) There is a non-refundable application fee of **\$400.00**. A check or money order must be made payable to the *Washington State Treasurer* and included with your application.

(2) The Board has contracted with MARITIME INSTITUTE of TECHNOLOGY and GRADUATE STUDIES/ "MITAGS" to develop the written examination. Upon notification of approval of an application to sit for the written exam, the applicant will reserve his or her place in the examination room by sending a non-refundable payment in the amount of **\$1,200.00** in the form of a <u>cashier's check</u>, made payable to "<u>MITAGS"</u>. Mail to: 1729 Alaskan Way S Seattle, WA 98134. It must be received within ten business days after notification by the Board.

(3) The simulator evaluation will be administered after the written examination has been scored. The Board will determine the cut score on the written examination that must be met or exceeded in order to be eligible to take the simulator evaluation. The results of the written examination and the number of applicants who qualify to take the simulator evaluation will be announced on April 7, 2021.

"MITAGS" in Seattle are the contractors to develop and administer the simulator evaluation. All applicants who qualify to take the simulator evaluation must make payment, in the amount of **\$2,000.00** in order to receive the chart and pre-voyage planning materials for the simulator evaluation. This payment must be made in the form of a <u>cashier's check</u>, made payable to "<u>MITAGS"</u>. The cashier's checks are to be delivered no later than 1600 hours Pacific Daylight Time on Friday April 9th to a designated person at "MITAGS" who will be identified in the future.
