### 8. What are the extended care options?

**Before-care runs from 7:30am-9:00am.** During this time students have free choice activities that they can participate in. Before-care is held Monday-Friday.

**Before-care cost: \$50/week**

After-care runs from 3:00-5:30pm. After-care is held Monday-Thursday. We don't hold after-care on Fridays because we have our performance on Friday afternoon at 3pm. The after-care schedule is as follows:

3:00pm-Snack

3:30pm-Walk to Cowen Park

4:30pm-Free Choice Sp Studio

5:30pm-After-care ends

**After-care cost: \$70/week**

**Cost for before and after-care is \$110/week**

### 9. When do I receive information about the camp once I have registered?

Everyone who is registered in a summer camp will get an email on June 1st with general information about summer camps. A week before your child's camp will start you will get a more specific email that will the camp's teachers and other important information for that week.

### 10. Who teaches the camps?

Depending on the week, we have several teachers. You can see their names, pictures and full bios on the page, "About Us".

### 11. What are your ratios?

We have a 1:8 teacher to student ratio for our summer camps.

### 12. When are the performances for the summer camps?

On the last day of camp, Friday, we have a performance that is open to family and friends. There is no cost for admission, so feel free to invite as many people as you would like. The show should last no longer than an hour. This year since our camp is ending at 3pm, the show will start at 3pm on Friday.



### 13. What should my child wear for the performance?


We ask that your child wear all black during the performance to have a base for any costume that might be placed on top, depending on what the teachers require.

### 14. What is the different between 2-week and 1-week camps?

During the 1-week camp, the students will learn a short show. They will all have a chance to speak some lines by themselves, if they choose, as well as learning the songs and dances that go along with the show. They will make small props and sets to correspond with the show and the directors might have them wear additional costume pieces too.

During the 2-week camp, the show that they will be working on will be longer than the 1-week camp. There are more chances for solos/monologues and the dancing can be slightly more complicated. They will make full props and sets for the show as well as some of the costumes.

### 15. What can I expect from the 3-week Theatre Intensive?



For the theatre intensive we put on a full Broadway junior show in the span of 3 weeks. The students audition for the show before the intensive happens so that they can receive their scripts and can be completely memorized by the time the camp starts. The ages for this camp is 10-14 and if your child is younger than they age group, they can be admitted into the camp if they have instructor permission. The performances will happen the weekend after the last week of camp it is a fully produced show with costumes, props, and projections. Just like for our other Junior productions each performer will receive a comp ticket for each performance.

### 16. What if my child is not old enough for a certain camp but they really want to attend?

The age restrictions on our camps are usually because we will be working on subject matter that could be deemed unsuitable for a younger age group. For example, we have a camp with a Harry Potter theme. Although we will not be doing the play on the Deathly Hallows, we cannot prevent the other children from talking about the subject matter of the book. If you are comfortable with your child possibly hearing about the dealings of that book, then you can petition to have your child attend the camp. We also like to keep the younger and the older age groups separate so they can be around children their own age. But once again if your child desperately wants to attend a camp with a certain theme, then we can certainly make allowances.

### 17. Is the summer camp allergy free?

Seattle's Performers is a nut free facility so we ask that none of the children bring nuts of any kind in their snacks and/or lunches. If your child has any other allergies, PLEASE let us know. We do have a separate table for children to sit at during lunch to make sure they don't come in contact with anything harmful.
