STUDENT MINUTE:

Zoe Tishaev, SMOB finalist, gave a short speech about her candidacy. Nate Tinbite was not present.

COMMUNITY MINUTE:

- Edison will have about 1100 students coming through next year
- New programs added this year: law enforcement

MCPS MINUTE – Cynthia Simonson:

- The Maryland school report card: assessed schools on a scale of 1-5 in assorted categories
- Local accountability model: don't *just* assess schools on one factor (grades in class, MAP, PARCC, etc.), but a combination of the factors, a more thorough look on the needs of the students

MCPS: reimagining the report card, breaking down the categories into 5 specific focus groups.

- o FARMs
 - Hispanic
 - African American
- o Black Non-FARMS
- Hispanic Non-FARMS
- Assessing the groups in the school, not just the school at large (a clearer focus on the achievement gap)
- *April 5th "Big Reveal" of the model,* 9 planned visits across the county before the end of the year

MARYLAND SAFE TO LEARN ACT – Mike Harting

Before: Schools evaluations performed by MCPS staff, walk through 206 schools in MCPS and quickly evaluate the locking of the doors, appropriate signage, etc. chat with principal, work orders filed

Now: Outside workers to help with the performance, 200 questions to thoroughly analyze, finish by June 15th. Evaluations of HS for 4 hours, MS for 3, ES for 2.

- Active assailant trainings completed for secondary schools, now rolling out to the elementary schools
- Page on site that summarizes Avoid, Deny, Defend
- We are *not* doing simulations: NO NERF GUNS. 😕
- Staff are given a 30 minute video and a training after school
- Students: 6 scenarios are presented and students must evaluate what to do in those situations
 - Presentations and language vary based on age group of students. Students in High, for example, are taught "Avoid, Deny, Defend." Language for Elementary varies considerably.

Questions: Is MCPS getting feedback from students on how it landed? Answer: Students are given an "index card" to submit questions

• Big focus on *situational awareness,* hence a lockdown with *options* -- students in the digital age seem to *lack* situational awareness due to the prevalence of smart devices

WHAT IS JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT FINANCE PARK?

There is a JA in PG and Fairfax, have been existing for over 5 years – MCPS' JA is in its first year (at Thomas Edison)!

Volunteers for the "store fronts" in JA are typically parents with expertise in the area. Thank you to the parents.

This year we had a "business challenge"- challenge students to produce their own business idea. Extension of ideas learned in the Finance Park of entrepreneurship.

OLD BUSINESS

Nominating Committee:

Good news: Full slate of officers!

Bad news: Lots of empty slots for Cluster Coordinators! Check with your Nominating Committee members and make a call to get someone for Cluster Coordinator.

CCs ARE THE BACKBONE OF MCCPTA AND THEY ARE VERY IMPORTANT. Every cluster can have up to 3 coordinators!

National PTA Due Increase:

- NatPTA has a convention in June in Ohio, any PTA member can attend, each state has specific #
 of delegates, Maryland gets ~20 delegates (we've never filled that allotment)
 Where do the dues go?
 - o \$2 goes to MDPTA

- o \$2.25 Goes to NAT PTA
 - \$1.61 Programs and Services
 - \$.15 Governance
 - \$.22 Property Management
 - \$.12 General and Administrative
- NATPTA votes on stances on *federal* legislation
- PTA plans to increase dues by \$1.50: PROPOSED NEW NAT PTA DUES = \$3.75
- Dues have not increased in 8 years
 - The addition will "secure our future" and maintain NATPTA's brand/influence
 - It will cover inflation
 - It will develop leadership

- Currently a proposal will come to the floor in June convention
- If it passes, dues will go into effect next school year
- Technically, dues *may* not mean increase individual member's payment, but PTA has to cover it somehow (have the conversation with your PTSAs!)
 - o Blair's PTSA doesn't charge members dues, just cover them from budget
- National PTA carries a *lot* of weight, Department of Ed. Gives serious consideration to their views on certain issues

NEW BUSINESS

Increasing Recess – Lauren Zolkiewicz, teacher at Wheaton

MCPS has the lowest amount of physical education requirements in Elementary – only 45 mins weekly.

BIG ISSUE: growing obesity problem in the United States, we need to lead the fight here

Physical activity proven to help with mental health

- In a school system similar demographics to MCPS, Texas study found increased recess increased *happiness, reduced bullying*
- Study also showed that increased play time did *not* yield lower (or higher) test scores

The problem: principals insisting we don't have the time for more recess, HOWEVER, students tend to be more *on task* following physical movement

The plan: change the culture.

- Encourage teachers to take classes outside
- Teachers can take their students outside for free play for up to 30 minutes a day

Here's the kicker: DOESN'T require an increase in the budget OR an increase in the school day. IT'S FREE. Two schools willing to pilot the idea:

- Westover ES
- Forest Mills ES

A lot more principals would be game if they got less testing in return.

More pilot schools welcome! If you are at/know of an elementary school that would be interested, reach out. Lauren is meeting with MCPS on **April 9th! REACH OUT BEFORE THEN!** The meeting is intended to give the pilot schools "permission" to put a focus on outdoor play, in the unlikely situation that the students decline in academic performance.

Racism 101 – Bruce Adelson, Churchill's PTSA President

Churchill seems to have a history of divisive racially-charged rhetoric

- "N-word pass" incident
- Racial profiling incident 2 years ago
- Swastika defacement

Churchill has increased their forum count – conversations on racial issues

New Principal has been more cooperative than previous on having forums. N-word pass phenomenon has been "going on for a long time," it only now arose because someone raised concerns

Many of the students don't fully *understand* the weight of the N-word. They're not in the curriculum, students never really taught.

Bruce Adelson is very willing to visit any school to speak

Planning on hosting an event at Churchill in the spring to talk about racial issues

Sherwood – Meeting April 4th at Sandy Spring Museum to discuss and reflect the past and future of the Sherwood community

Budget Amendments – Khristy Kartsakalis

Amendments to reduce carryover amt (REDUCED TO \$47,512.79):

- Currently sending \$125 to ACT-SO, YET we are sending 1,500 to MSP and MCR: increase to \$1,500 (+1,125)
- Advocacy Commmittee: Increase budget (+400)

Proposed amendment: \$200 per cluster but add \$500 for schools that are hosting the BOE (there are 7 this year) (+\$ 3500 (500 * 7))

Lead Bill

- Currently MCPS uses the threshold of 20 parts per billion for lead to evaluate "high level"
 Literally everyone else uses 10 or less
- Bill 2-19, proposed County Council bill to lower that standard to 5 parts per billion
- All outlets above 20 have been cut off
- Currently: moving to replace those with >5ppb
 - Starting with water coolers big water fountains by gyms that have coolers in them
 - Then moving to "bubblers," the fountains in classrooms by the sinks
- \$50,000 to replace water coolers

That's at the county, there's one on the state level as well

- Passed the House, no opposition (HB 1253)
- Currently stuck in Senate
- Focusing on Kagan and Pinsky

The following bills have been passed by the House, not yet the Senate:

HB-0725 Restorative Approaches, meeting tomorrow, Kagan is on the committee

Daily Physical Activity Student activity increase to 150 hours a day

HB 110 – paying for lawyers

HB 256 - Trauma-informed approach bill

HB 0727 Maryland Build to Learn Act (<u>http://mgaleg.maryland.gov/2019RS/bills/hb/hb0727T.pdf</u>) Public school construction - state funding +400million, has to be matched by the county (Senators King and Zucker)

Role Montgomery College Plays – Cynthia Simonson

60% of students in MCPS end up at Montgomery College for some purpose, 25% go there directly

- Sometimes it's defeated students returning to education
- Sometimes it's university-bound students looking to save some cash

The problem: while MCPS has a great relationship with MC, many parents don't know much about it

MC is an *excellent resource* that we need to spread the word about. Need to get the conversation started *before* high school so it can be integrated into 4-year plans.
