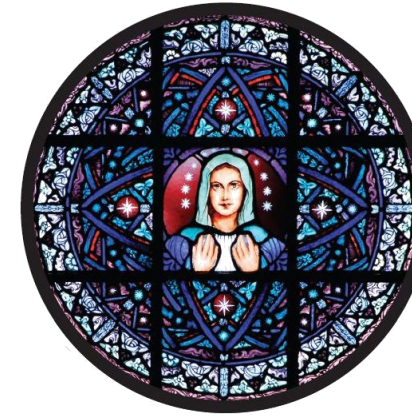

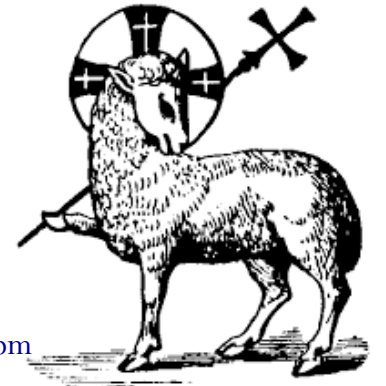

THE CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Irreligion

2118 God's first commandment condemns the main sins of irreligion: tempting God, in words or deeds, sacrilege, and simony.

2119 Tempting God consists in putting his goodness and almighty power to the test by word or deed. Thus Satan tried to induce Jesus to throw himself down from the Temple and, by this gesture, force God to act. Jesus opposed Satan with the word of God: "You shall not put the LORD your God to the test." The challenge contained in such tempting of God wounds the respect and trust we owe our Creator and Lord. It always harbors doubt about his love, his providence, and his power.

2120 Sacrilege consists in profaning or treating unworthily the sacraments and other liturgical actions, as well as persons, things, or places consecrated to God. Sacrilege is a grave sin especially when committed against the Eucharist, for in this sacrament the true Body of Christ is made substantially present for us.

CATECISMO DE LA IGLESIA CATOLICA

La irreligión

2118 El primer mandamiento de Dios reprueba los principales pecados de irreligión: la acción de tentar a Dios con palabras o con obras, el sacrilegio y la simonía.

2119 La acción de tentar a Dios consiste en poner a prueba, de palabra o de obra, su bondad y su omnipotencia. Así como Satán quería conseguir de Jesús que se arrojara del templo y obligase a Dios, mediante este gesto, a actuar (cf Lc 4, 9). Jesús le opone las palabras de Dios: "No tentaréis al Señor, tu Dios" (Dt 6, 16). El reto que contiene este tentar a Dios lesiona el respeto y la confianza que debemos a nuestro Creador y Señor. Incluye siempre una duda respecto a su amor, su providencia y su poder (cf 1 Co 10, 9; Ex 17, 2-7; Sal 95, 9).

2120 El sacrilegio consiste en profanar o tratar indignamente los sacramentos y las otras acciones litúrgicas, así como las personas, las cosas y los lugares consagrados a Dios. El sacrilegio es un pecado grave sobre todo cuando es cometido contra la Eucaristía, pues en este sacramento el Cuerpo de Cristo se nos hace presente substancialmente (cf CIC can. 1367. 1376).

PERMANENT MASS SCHEDULE CHANGES TO COME

As has been announced STARTING WITH THE WEEKEND OF AUGUST 31/SEPTEMBER 1, a new Mass time schedule will be adopted for the Parish. This NEW schedule will be as follows:

- The 9:00 am Saturday morning Spanish Mass will be cancelled;
A regular daily Mass will be celebrated on Saturday mornings at 9:00 am. This Mass will not fulfill your Sunday obligation however;
The 5:30 pm Saturday Vigil Mass will remain the same and in English;
The 8:15 am Sunday morning Mass will be moved to 8:30 am and will be prayed in Spanish;
The 11:00 am Sunday morning Mass will remain the same and prayed in English.

These changes have been under serious and prayerful consideration for a significant period of time by Father Peter and the Parish Pastoral Council as to how best to accommodate the changing needs of the Parish. They are being undertaken for the following reasons:

- Changes in parish demographics have necessitated a review of our Parish's needs.
The Bishop notified us that the 9:00 am Saturday Spanish Mass is not in conformance with the time requirements for a valid Sunday Mass which must occur late Saturday afternoon and so had to be removed from the schedule.
The work schedules for many parishioners strongly favors an early morning Sunday Mass time. The 8:30 am Sunday Mass was the most sensible option for our Spanish Mass as a result and was moved to 8:30 am to accommodate work schedules yet maintain an early Mass on Sundays for everyone.
The 11:00 am Mass which will remain at the same time and in English will provide for time in between the two Sunday Masses for our regular Religious Education Programs and after Mass activities and will be prayed in English as is currently the case.
Dwindling numbers of parishioners/Mass attendants suggest that an increased number of Masses is not warranted at this time.
After careful and prayerful discernment these changes are believed to best represent the current needs of our Parish and will be adopted.
