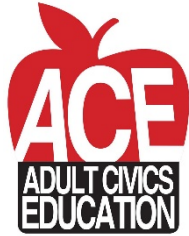
Nominations Now Being Accepted for President's Award of Excellence for Outstanding Civics Teacher
