22nd Sunday Ordinary Year B Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23



'When the Pharisees with some scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around Jesus, they observed that some of his disciples ate their meals with unclean, that is, unwashed, hands. —For the Pharisees and, in fact, all Jews, do not eat without carefully washing their hands, keeping the tradition of the elders. And on coming from the marketplace they do not eat without purifying themselves. And there are many other things that they have traditionally observed, the purification of cups and jugs and kettles and beds. — So the Pharisees and scribes questioned him, "Why do your disciples not follow the tradition of the elders but instead eat a meal with unclean hands?" He responded, "Well did Isaiah prophesy about you hypocrites, as it is written: This people honors me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me; in vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines human precepts. You disregard God's commandment but cling to human tradition." He summoned the crowd again and said to them, "Hear me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile. "From within people, from their hearts, come evil thoughts, unchastity, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, licentiousness, envy, blasphemy, arrogance, folly. All these evils come from within and they defile."

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

22nd Sunday Ordinary Year B

Mk 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

"There are two ways to get out of debt: 1) earn more or 2) spend less. If you do both, you'll get there faster." This is a common refrain taught by the Nashville based Christian financial counselor Dave Ramsey (in addition to his frequent 'credit card cutting' ceremonies!) He is saying that there is a 'money in' direction and 'money out' direction, and of course he is counseling to keep close tabs on both! I hear Jesus say something similar in today's gospel! Not the money part, today, but the focus on 'in & out'! Some Pharisees and Jerusalem scribes show up to condemn Jesus, saying, "Your disciples eat with unwashed hands!" (Mk 7:5). The Pharisees are demanding that the disciples 'wash, wash, wash' their food, hands and bowls. But instead of getting hung up on their 'washing' compulsion, Jesus says 'Watch, Watch, Watch'. And more important than 'watching the food going in', they need to 'watch what comes out of their mouths and hearts." Good lesson: We all need to spend more energy watching what words come out of my mouth, than waste time nitpicking over what food goes into my mouth. Now, there were prescribed 'washing' rituals that the Jewish faith commanded, which Mark tediously outlines (Mark 7:3-4). Yet, Jesus points out that such a fixation on the cups or kettles being unclean, leads them to overlook their own heart's uncleanness. Which is more important: the dirt on my dish or a stain in my soul, like anger, greed or lust? In Mark 7:15, Jesus says, "Nothing that enters one from outside can defile that person; but the things that come out from within are what defile." It is not the food in my stomach that indicates my cleanliness or not. No, it is what I let in and hold in my heart that determines my purity or impurity for Jesus. In Matthew 6:21, Jesus teaches that "Where your heart is, there also will be your treasure." Jesus reinforces here the wisdom of Proverbs 4:23, that warns us to watch what we let into our souls, when it said, "With all vigilance guard your heart, for in it are the sources of life." Whatever we let keep us company in our hearts, is what makes the difference between our holiness or sin.

Often, after some public preaching episode of Jesus with the crowds, the disciples later on will privately ask Jesus for clarifications about His teaching. In Mark 4:10 we read that "When Jesus was alone, those present along with the Twelve questioned him about the parables." In Matthew 24:3, we hear that after Jesus retreated to the Mount of Olives, "the disciples approached him privately and said, "Tell us, when will this happen?" Or in Matthew 17:19, we hear that "the disciples approached Jesus in private and said, "Why could we not drive it out?" The same 'private moment' clearing up of confusion occurs with the disciples and Jesus in today's gospel. After this encounter with the Pharisees, Mark 7:17 adds that "When he got home away from the crowd his disciples questioned him about the parable".

Perhaps they hadn't grasped the seriousness of the charge that Jesus was answering the Jerusalem authorities over, with their legal 'hygiene' complaint against Him, or maybe they were following up with Jesus on whether they needed to change their behavior or customs to better fit with Jerusalem's rules. But Jesus reasserts the spiritual principle that what is most important about 'purity' is keeping 'pure' hearts and minds, not 'spotless' dishes or shiny bowls. Jesus is not hung up on which foods to eat or not eat or how they must be eaten, Jesus draws attention to the more important duty of how to interact purely with other human beings. Pure Behavior, clean living is what Jesus is after. Jesus tells them, "Do you not realize that everything that goes into a person's mouth from outside cannot defile, since it enters not the heart but the stomach and passes out into the latrine!" (Mark 7:18-19) There is something of a *smiling hint* from Jesus' as He mentions 'latrines'. Talking about the end of the line of their fixation on food, Jesus was saying that the Pharisees end up in the 'dump'. Jesus was basically saying, "Pharisees, get your minds out of the gutters-(sewage plumbing)". Jesus wants them to focus on the heart, not the stomach, when talking about 'purity'! St Paul will pick up on this same theme later, reasserting in his letter to the Philippians 3:19 that for detractors of Christianity, "Their God is their stomach". Jesus' focus was on 'pure conduct' between people, and 'right behavior' in all of our social interactions. In the end, we will be judged not on what foods we ate or didn't eat, but on what conduct we exhibited toward our brothers and sisters-not our diet but Peace. Fr Brian our deeds!
