Center for Special Children, for many years.


According to his teacher, Ms. Kristina, Jimmy loves interacting with his classmates and enjoys when his friends share toys, read books and play on the playground with him.

Jimmy's expressive blue eyes, infectious smile and giggle are sure to make anyone at HLVS happy!














Through the generosity of the Vietnam Veterans of America #82, Nassau County Chapter, HLVS was fortunate to receive a "Light Box" and accessories for use with our


students who have visual impairments.

Room 25 Learns About Animals and Pets






