Covered the importance of having flood insurance, despite being in an "X" Flood Zone; X zones account for about 30% of paid flood insurance claims; In a disaster, without a presidential declaration of emergency and no flood insurance you receive NO assistance, WITH declaration FEMA will pay out up to \$30K but move to demolish and this does not cover contents of home; Flood insurance for renters is contents only, for owners of rental property can be made for the structure only; In case of flooding, it's a good idea to take small valuables and place them in air tight zipper bags or containers and store in your dishwasher, as it's created to keep water in during a wash cycle and can keep water out and valuables safe during a major flood. www.melissaems.com

City has the lowest crime rates in 6 years with a 10% decrease in all crimes (including violent), 21 car burglaries in the last month, ALL HAD UNLOCKED DOORS; APAD (Adult Pre-Arrest Diversion Program) in place, within 24 hours of their minor misdemeanor offense, adults can register with the Sheriff's Department to complete the program to avoid a criminal record; St Pete has a gang issue, but not like on TV, mostly kids from the neighborhood getting together SPPD is targeting these groups to try to get kids back on the right track or arrest them; New SPPD station breaking ground on April 20th and will take about 18 months to complete; Park, Walk, & Talk Program is still in effect and going well
