NARRATIVE: This is a taped statement of Heath Stocks. This statement is being taken at the Cummins Unit of the Arkansas Department of Corrections. Present is Chief Peckat, Officer Kay Thompson, who is an Officer with the Arkansas Department of Corrections, and Heath Stocks.

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Chief Peckat: Heath, I've discussed with you some instances that you have described to me, where you have had contact with Jack Walls. Is that correct?

Heath Stocks: Yes, sir.

Chief Peckat: Do you know what Jack Walls' real name is?

Heath Stocks: Charles Walls, the third.

Chief Peckat: Okay. When was the first time approximately, when was the first time you came in contact with Jack?

Heath Stocks: About eight or nine years old.

Chief Peckat: You were eight or nine years old?

Heath Stocks: Eight or nine years old.

Chief Peckat: Okay. That would have been approximately nineteen-eighty-five.

Heath Stocks: Eighty-five to eighty-seven, somewhere in there, you know, I was eight, nine, ten, something.

Chief Peckat: Okay.

Heath Stocks: I was still young.

Chief Peckat: All right. The first incident that ever occurred between you and Jack that involved sexual connotation to it, when did it occur? What age were you?

Heath Stocks: About probably ten or eleven.

Chief Peckat: So, this would be approximately two years after you had first met him.

Heath Stocks: A couple of years.

Chief Peckat: Where did this incident occur at?

Heath Stocks: The Boy Scout camp, in Arkansas, I'm not sure exactly where it is.

Chief Peckat: This is where all the Scouts get together from the different groups.

Heath Stocks: Right. Earn their merit badges, and things like that.

Chief Peckat: Okay what, were you drinking there?

Heath Stocks: heavy, everybody.

Chief Peckat: Who gave you the alcohol?

Heath Stocks: Jack Walls.

Chief Peckat: Now you say everybody, do you remember any of the people, boys, or whoever that was there?

Heath Stocks: Rob Evatt, Tucker, Chase Tucker, I think Wade Knox, who the other guys were there.

Chief Peckat: Okay. While, you were drinking for a while and then you had explained to me that, that.

Heath Stocks: The other guys left.

Chief Peckat: All the other boys walked up into the woods or away from you, is that correct?

Heath Stocks: Yeah, and kept drinking.

Chief Peckat: And kept drinking, and who did that leave over by the camp?

Heath Stocks: Me and Jack.

Chief Peckat: And what happened between you and Jack?

Heath Stocks: Jack forced me to have oral sex on him.

Chief Peckat: How did he force you?

Heath Stocks: With his hands.

Chief Peckat: Okay explain what he did.

Heath Stocks: He grabbed me by the head and forced me down on top of him.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Did he also have oral sex with you?

Heath Stocks: Yes.

Chief Peckat: Did he force you to have oral sex with him first, or was it the other way around?

Heath Stocks: I think he was first.

Chief Peckat: He was first.

Heath Stocks: Yeah. Well, I did this, kind of like, I did this for you, then you know, you got to do this for me, kind of thing.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Was there any statements made to you by any of the other kids or by Jack after this incident had occurred?

Heath Stocks: Rob Evatt and Chase Tucker.

Chief Peckat: And what did they say to you?

Heath Stocks: "Well, you're in the group now".

Chief Peckat: You're in the "group" now.

Heath Stocks: "you're in the group now".

Chief Peckat: And that "group" consisted of who?

Heath Stocks: Chase Tucker, Rob Evatt, let's see, Chad Cooper, I'm not sure, but Matthew Bridges was in there or not, I think Mark, Mark McConnell, I think he was in there, did I say Wade, I don't know if Josh was old enough to be there or not.

Chief Peckat: Was Jack a part of that "group"?

Heath Stocks: Jack was leader of the "group".

Chief Peckat: Leader. And what benefits did you receive to be a member of that "group"?

Heath Stocks: Alcohol, some of the guys got to go shot guns, we did things like that, provided whore occasionally.

Chief Peckat: A whore.

Heath Stocks: A whore.

Chief Peckat: Okay anything else?

Heath Stocks: Ammunition, alcohol, dirty books of course, when we were at the camp and stuff like that that's about it.

Chief Peckat: What about you sexual frustrations, as in the "group", anything to deal with sexual frustrations?



Heath Stocks: Masturbation together, "group" masturbation, oral sex on each other, on Jack on us.

Chief Peckat: Now this is, was there any conversation brought up by Jack, such as because of your age, did he ever inquire about your sexual activities?

Heath Stocks: How we were doing with our girlfriends, who we were seeing, if we were having sex, if we weren't, weren't getting any, I guess you could say, those who weren't, you know, were more susceptible, I guess you could say, to the activities that were going on, you know, I think everybody was usually involved at one point the other at the camp.

Chief Peckat: So if you weren't getting any outside from your girlfriends then you could relieve yourself within the "group".

Heath Stocks: There, within the "group".

Chief Peckat: do you remember the second incident when it occurred?

Heath Stocks: Jack's farm.

Chief Peckat: Do you remember who was there in that incident?

Heath Stocks: Rob Evatt, Chase Tucker, Blake Burrows, me, Rob, and Blake were in together, in the tent together with Jack, I think Chad Cooper and Matthew Bridges, and Mark McConnell and all them were out at the fire.

Chief Peckat: Okay, but you, Blake, Rob and Jack were all in the tent.

Heath Stocks: All in the tent together.

Chief Peckat: What happened while you were in the tent?

Heath Stocks: We were drunk and he made us either perform, well he performed oral sex on me and then had Blake Burrows perform oral sex on me, and then Blake performed oral sex on him, I tried to roll over and go to sleep really.

Chief Peckat: Okay.

Heath Stocks: And then they were over there by themselves doing whatever.

Chief Peckat: And Jack performed oral sex on you?

Heath Stocks: Yes.

Chief Peckat: How long after the first incident did this incident occur, approximately?

Heath Stocks: Probably the same year, later on that year.

Chief Peckat: A couple of months afterwards?

Heath Stocks: Probably.

Chief Peckat: Okay, I'm asking could it have been more than two months or?

Heath Stocks: It could have been, but at least the same year. (inaudible)

Chief Peckat: This first incident, would that have been in summer months?

Heath Stocks: Yeah.

Chief Peckat: Do you remember at the second incident if it was cooler out?

Heath Stocks: It was Fall.

Chief Peckat: It was the Fall.

Heath Stocks: It was.

Chief Peckat: Okay.

Heath Stocks: Scout Camp was the end of summer, August, July, August, and then.

Chief Peckat: How many incidents occurred like the second incident that you described, over a period of from nineteen-eighty-seven, to nineteen-ninety-five?

Heath Stocks: Counting the times of just me and Jack at his house or wherever it may be probably between fifty and seventy-five.

Chief Peckat: Are you aware of the last time that Jack had a trial dealing with his conduct at a Boy Scout camp in Carlisle?

Heath Stocks: Oh, with Doug Hogan.

Chief Peckat: Were you ever approached by Jack to do anything, what so ever, to assist him in either getting rid of the Hogan's or assist him in winning this trial at all?

Heath Stocks: I had to go to court as, a couple of guys were there to testify unnecessary that he wasn't guilty of what happened, then later on the same guys were given license plate numbers and things like that, try to hunt down Doug, beat him up, as time progressed we got more serious and then the open orders to pretty much kill them both, him and his father both.

Chief Peckat: Who were given those orders?

Heath Stocks: Me, me, more so.

Chief Peckat: You were.

Heath Stocks: Out of the "group".

Chief Peckat: How were you to kill'em?

Heath Stocks: Shoot'em.

Chief Peckat: Shoot'em, and do you know of anybody else that was given those orders?

Heath Stocks: I think Wade was.

Chief Peckat: And who were the orders given by?

Heath Stocks: Jack Walls.

Chief Peckat: You had mentioned a couple of boys, now do you know any incident that occurred involving Chris Hutchins and Doug?

Heath Stocks: Jack had got Chris to beat him up, and Chris had broke his hand, broke his hand on his head, I guess.

Chief Peckat: Were you promised anything from Jack in return for killing?

Heath Stocks: Money, praise. Praise more so than anything, that's what I dwelled on.

Chief Peckat: Praise.

Heath Stocks: From Jack, making him happy.

Chief Peckat: Were you Jack's boy?

Heath Stocks: Son.

Chief Peckat: Son, you called him dad.

Heath Stocks: A few times.

Chief Peckat: Did you look up to him as your dad?

Heath Stocks: Very much so.

Chief Peckat: Do anything for him that he wanted you to do?

Heath Stocks: Anything he asked, anything.

Chief Peckat: Do you know of any instances where other people were harassed as a result that Jack being, pissed off at him?

Heath Stocks: Larry Roberts.

Chief Peckat: And Larry Roberts was a Boy Scout leader?

Heath Stocks: Use to be.

Chief Peckat: And why was Larry Roberts harassed and how was he harassed?

Heath Stocks: Keyed his car, I think that.

Chief Peckat: Who did?

Heath Stocks: Wade, and sugared, I think they even sugared his gas tank, spray painted the house, egged the house.

Chief Peckat: Why was this done?

Heath Stocks: Because when Jack first went to trial, Larry Roberts and Doug Hogan's father were in it together trying to get people to testify against Jack to convict him over Doug's case or whatever, and you know, he told us to make it hell on them, so we did.

Chief Peckat: Okay did you ever egg the house?

Heath Stocks: The night they pulled me over and questioned me when I walked by, I had something metal in my hand and I scraped the side of his car with it. That was the only thing really I ever did to Mr. Roberts, but Wade, that was, Wade loved that, Wade did most of that.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Okay.

Heath Stocks: Of course, he's right across the street from Jack.

Chief Peckat: Right next door, isn't he?

Heath Stocks: Yeah, right next door. He'd go over there get guns, go shoot'em, things like that, hey, that's Uncle Jack to Wade.

Chief Peckat: You were offered money and praise to kill, Doug. What about Doug's father?

Heath Stocks: Both of them, it was kind of a group deal.

Chief Peckat: Now, this trial was in nineteen-ninety-four, he was arrested in nineteen-ninety-three on these charges. How long did this keep up on trying to keep up with the Hogan family?

Heath Stocks: It had been going on the whole time, ever since then.

Chief Peckat: Up to, since, up to the time came into prison, or got arrested?

Heath Stocks: Yes.

Chief Peckat: So the incident involving you occurred in January of ninety-seven, is that correct?

Heath Stocks: Yes, sir.



Chief Peckat: So up to the time you were arrested, were you still trying to hunt down this family under the direction of Jack Walls?

Heath Stocks: Yes, sir.

Chief Peckat: And how, where's that going on? How were you doing that?

Heath Stocks: Looking for them, looking for license plate number, license plate cars, the cars that they were suppose to be driving. Jack had told us a couple of hang out places where he had went and where he usually stayed, places he usually went, malls, things like that where, you know, somebody had been telling him. Tucker, Tucker did a lot of chasing, watched him a lot, saw where he was going, usually, and then if one of us popped up, you know, he'd change his whole routine, he'd change going to different places, drive for hours if he had to just to.

Chief Peckat: Did somebody actually get his license plate numbers, get Hogan's license plate number?

Heath Stocks: All of them.

Chief Peckat: Did they turn it over to Jack?

Heath Stocks: Everything was always given to Jack.

Chief Peckat: Did Jack ever track those license plate numbers once to, Hogan's moved to Carlisle?

Heath Stocks: The Hogan's were in Carlisle they just moved to a different house in Carlisle, but Jack didn't really have to track them, he had all us tracking them, and he gave us a list of all the, like I said he gave us a list of all the license plates and things like that, colors of the cars, years, the make, model, whatever.

Chief Peckat: And he wanted you to kill'em? Did he say how he wanted you to kill'em?

Heath Stocks: I was going to shoot'em.

Chief Peckat: You was going to shoot'em. Did you ever hear anything mentioned between Jack and anyone about burning up the Hogan's in their vehicle?

Heath Stocks: It was mentioned, but it wasn't mentioned to me.

Chief Peckat: Who was it mentioned to?

Heath Stocks: I'm not for sure, but I think Wade and Rob, and Tucker were involved in it.

Chief Peckat: Do you remember how they were going to burn up in the vehicle?

Heath Stocks: No, I don't remember exactly, I mean, I remember there was talk about cutting a brake line, things like that, but I don't remember what exactly they were talking about, burning the car up.



Chief Peckat: Was there any, did Jack ever mention fire or burning things or?

Heath Stocks: All the time, he loves fire. He's a fireman, he has been working with fire a long time.

Chief Peckat: Do you think he could burn something up and get away with it?

Heath Stocks: He was invincible. Jack could do anything you wanted to do and never get caught.

Chief Peckat: Did he ever mention to you that he could burn somebody up and never get caught?

Heath Stocks: Very much so, that's why I was so scared of him. That's why we never did anything to piss him, I guess you could say. I always did what he told us to do, never tried to make him mad, didn't want to.

Chief Peckat: How many times were you told to kill the Hogan's?

Heath Stocks: Numerous.

Chief Peckat: Numerous times.

Heath Stocks: It always came up in every conversation that I ever talked to him, if I had seen him, you know, where he was at, what he was driving, if I did see him.

Chief Peckat: Did you ever see any notes that Jack had as far as the Hogan's, that he was keeping on their whereabouts?

Heath Stocks: No, not really, it was just always verbal, most of time.

Chief Peckat: Okay.

Heath Stocks: Guys coming in and telling him what they had saw, where they had saw him at, whatever.

Chief Peckat: Do you know if Jack ever had anal intercourse with you?

Heath Stocks: Thought he had.

Chief Peckat: Okay you say you thought he had, why are you saying that?

Heath Stocks: Most of the time I was drunk and couldn't remember what happened.

Chief Peckat: What made you think that he may have though?

Heath Stocks: Soreness, a little blood sometimes.

Chief Peckat: Soreness and a little blood. When you went on camping trips, who did you sleep with?

Heath Stocks: Usually Jack, the same tent as Jack.

Chief Peckat: The same tent, but not with Jack?

Heath Stocks: No.

Chief Peckat: These incidents that occurred, you had mentioned fifty to seventy-five times, where did they occur at?

Heath Stocks: They ranged anywhere from Boy Scout camp, Jack's farm, his house, his shop, the shop's right there next to the house, I mean it's joined to it practically.

Chief Peckat: Did you ever engage in any of these acts or oral sex or masturbation, while his family was home?

Heath Stocks: Yeah, we'd go outside to his shop, usually I went out there to look at guns, things like that, and then he'd start asking questions about my girlfriend or whoever I was dating, and you know, try to get me turned on or excited or whatever and then try to perform oral sex on me or.

Chief Peckat: Tried to or he would?

Heath Stocks: Most of the time he would.

Chief Peckat: Okay. The last time that this occurrence, anything that happened between you and Jack was when?

Heath Stocks: Probably first year of college.

Chief Peckat: Do you remember what year that was?

Heath Stocks: Fall, of ninety-five, and the spring of ninety-six.

Chief Peckat: And that would be the last incident, and do you remember what that incident was, as far as was it oral sex or touching or what, what was it?

Heath Stocks: It was either oral in his shop or masturbation in the house watching porno, porno flicks on television.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Do you know of any incident with Jack wanting to have sex with your girlfriends?

Heath Stocks: Tried to get me to bring girls over there that were wild, that I had slept with and been with, yes.

Chief Peckat: Who I members of your "group"?

Heath Stocks: Rob Evatt, me, of course Jack, Chase Tucker, Blake Burrows, I'm not sure, but most, most of the guys were in the brotherhood or the order of arrow, usually brotherhood, so that included Chad Cooper, Matthew Bridges, Mark McConnell.

Chief Peckat: Would they be a member of that same group, though, of what you call the "group"?

Heath Stocks: I never seen them involved in with Jack, but that didn't mean it wasn't happen cause they were always there at the camp when that stuff was going on, you know, they might have been, you know, they might have done it at an early time or later on that night or something like that, but.

Chief Peckat: Have you ever heard that in order to get to Betty you had to go through Jack, you had to do something with Jack first before you ever got to Betty?

Heath Stocks: You had to be in a "group".

Chief Peckat: In order to get in the "group" you had to do something with Jack.

Heath Stocks: Got to be with Jack.

Chief Peckat: Now be with Jack that means doing something sexual with Jack?

Heath Stocks: Yes.

Chief Peckat: In order to be in the "group", your initiation was doing something with Jack.

Heath Stocks: Sexual with Jack.

Chief Peckat: And you were told by Rob Evatt, that night it occurred to you that you were now in the "group".

Heath Stocks: "In the group".

Chief Peckat: And at that point did you know what being in the "group" meant?

Heath Stocks: It was pretty, it's almost like a fraternity of guys, it's kind of limited to who gets in it, I think Jack and some older guys had been in it for a while, they usually decide who gets in it, who's forced or whatever.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Have you ever heard of "Betty Parties"?

Heath Stocks: Kind of like a group whore, Jack (inaudible) and get Betty to come out to Jack's farm and all the guys would take turns on her.

Chief Peckat: Did you ever take a turn on her?

Heath Stocks: I never got to.

Chief Peckat: Why?

Heath Stocks: Either she was busy and couldn't come, there was only a couple of incidents that I was out there, that they actually tried to get her to come. I heard some of the guy's talk about her though.



Chief Peckat: Okay.

Heath Stocks: They had went with Jack by her house something like that, and.

Chief Peckat: Why was she so popular with Jack?

Heath Stocks: Jack had been using her for the Scouts to sleep with for years and years at a time, so I can't even, I mean I know some people that re in their thirties now that slept with her.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Do you remember what her house looks like?

Heath Stocks: White, two-story, I think, house.

Chief Peckat: Anything in the backyard?

Heath Stocks: Maybe a pool, maybe, I'm not real sure, there's some trees around the house. I know it's on, what's that eight-nine, South, going out towards Remington.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Why did you stay with Jack? Why did, what was your relationship with Jack other than these sexual instances that you've occurred, that you already described?

Heath Stocks: Friend, father, mentor.

Chief Peckat: What was he preparing you for?

Heath Stocks: To be a killer.

Chief Peckat: How did you know that?

Heath Stocks: That's what he was training me to be, that's what he wanted me to be, kill people for him, for money. Whoever and whenever.

Chief Peckat: Did he in fact tell you that?

Heath Stocks: Numerous times.

Chief Peckat: Numerous times, he told you he wanted you to kill for him. Was he preparing you for that?

Heath Stocks: Mentally.

Chief Peckat: Mentally.

Heath Stocks: He said, I was trying to go in the Army, I was trying to go in the Army Delta Force, or he said, Navy Seals either one will prepare me physically, but he had me ready mentally, you know, he didn't think I had a conscience, he told me couldn't

have a conscience, couldn't love anything, you know, just do it and no second thoughts, just do it and it didn't mean anything.

Chief Peckat: Do you have weapons in order to engage in this type of conduct, to be a killer?

Heath Stocks: I was, I had a forty-five being prepared with a silencer on it of a rifle, old military rifle that was converted to a forty-five, shot forty-five (inaudible) pistol bullet.

Chief Peckat: Okay now you said you had a forty-five?

Heath Stocks: Well, Jack was preparing it for me, getting somebody to do it.

Chief Peckat: Was it your gun or was it Jack's gun?

Heath Stocks: It was Jack's gun, I had paid money for it to have it done. Jack pretty much gave me the gun, it was just going to cost money to get it silenced, two hundred dollars.

Chief Peckat: Was he building the silencer?

Heath Stocks: No, a friend.

Chief Peckat: Did he say who he was going to kill?

Heath Stocks: Just anybody that really opposed him, anybody he wanted killed.

Chief Peckat: You have in fact, been convicted of killing people, is that correct?

Heath Stocks: Yes. My mom and dad.

Chief Peckat: When Jack was your mentor did you ever go and talk to him about your problems?

Heath Stocks: Always. He was the only person really I talked to about my problems, I wouldn't talk to my parents, I talked to him.

Chief Peckat: Well did you go and talk to Jack about the problems that you were having with your parents?

Heath Stocks: Always.

Chief Peckat: What advise did he give you?

Heath Stocks: Well at first you know he tried to, you know it was always, you know, try to get along, whatever, and it just got to the point where it just got so bad he just told me if I couldn't work it out to kill'em.

Chief Peckat: If you couldn't work it out to kill'em?

Heath Stocks: Kill'em.

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Chief Peckat: If you couldn't work it out to kill'em?

Heath Stocks: Kill'em.



Chief Peckat: When was the last time that you had that conversation with him before you actually did that?

Heath Stocks: About a year.

Chief Peckat: About a year. You didn't ever discuss it with him at anytime during that year.

Heath Stocks: Not really, just the problems, just the problems we were having still, things like that.

Chief Peckat: Okay. Now during that year were you living with your parents the year before this occurred, or were you in and out living there?

Heath Stocks: Living out, I got kicked out and then moved back home for a little while then I went to college.

Chief Peckat: Jack ever visit you in jail?

Heath Stocks: Once.

Chief Peckat: Where was that at?

Heath Stocks: Lenoire County.

Chief Peckat: What was your conversation while, when he visited you?

Heath Stocks: About my conscience, about things he had told me about how I need to feel about killing people and things like that, if I had a conscience.

Chief Peckat: What did he tell you, that you had one, that you didn't have one?

Heath Stocks: Said I didn't.

Chief Peckat: He told you, you didn't. Did he tell you he'd stand by you?

Heath Stocks: Always. I stood by him through his trial, he'd stand by me.

Chief Peckat: Did he?

Heath Stocks: He's not here now.

Chief Peckat: Who went out to your house after your, the incident with your parent's?

Heath Stocks: Jack.

Chief Peckat: Who went out to your house and watched the house?

Heath Stocks: Jack.

Chief Peckat: Would this be the day after your parent's were killed?

Heath Stocks: I think so.

Chief Peckat: You think the day after. Why did Jack do out there?

Heath Stocks: Watch after the house, I guess help me if he could.

Chief Peckat: Did Jack know your parents?

Heath Stocks: Friends with them.

Chief Peckat: Was friends with them.

Heath Stocks: Or they thought he was.

Chief Peckat: Did your parents ever go and talk to Jack about the problems that you were having and getting along with your parents?

Heath Stocks: Always, because I had talked to Jack, they had talked to him find out what was going on. My family was scared of me.

Chief Peckat: They were scared of you?

Heath Stocks: My mom and dad and my sister. I'm not sure my dad was, but my mom and my sister were really. They thought I was changing.

Chief Peckat: If a fire was to be started, have you ever stopped and talked to Jack on how to get a fire started, how to keep it going, how he could do it without getting away with it?

Heath Stocks: Never needed to, but if I had of I could have asked Jack, and he would have told me.

Chief Peckat: You had told me earlier that Jack had said the best way to do a fire is with plain newspaper.

Heath Stocks: Plain newspaper, cause it would burn, and you could tell, that way it would look like a electric.

Chief Peckat: What else did Jack tell you he had to start fires with?

Heath Stocks: Chemicals, mixing chemicals, combustion, you know, chemical reaction produces heat and then start, but you know that's not as good because residue left behind could be tested, find it.

Chief Peckat: The deal with the Hogan's, would you say that in your opinion, was Jack obsessed in getting even with them?

Heath Stocks: Totally.

Chief Peckat: Did it start out that way?

Heath Stocks: That Jack would have never of done anything like that.

Chief Peckat: But you know that's a lie.

Heath Stocks: Know it's a lie.

Chief Peckat: What do you want done as far as what Jack did to you?

Heath Stocks: He's possessed with getting even, so am I. I'd rather get even, he deserves what he gets, whatever that may be.

Chief Peckat: Is what your telling me right now, is just trying to get even with, or is it something that really happened?

Heath Stocks: It happened, he destroyed my life.

Chief Peckat: You trusted in him, right?

Heath Stocks: Believed in him. I almost thought he was god.

Chief Peckat: What he was telling you wasn't the truth?

Heath Stocks: No. He made me think he cared bout me, that wasn't ever true.

Chief Peckat: Anything else that you want to say?

Heath Stocks: He's sick.

Chief Peckat: "He's sick". How long do you think he's been doing this with boys? How long do you know about?

Heath Stocks: I know people in their thirties, early thirties.

Chief Peckat: That he's done it with.

Heath Stocks: Back since he was in his twenty years.

Chief Peckat: Do you know their names?

Heath Stocks: Know a couple.

Chief Peckat: Can you tell me?

Heath Stocks: One of them is J.J. Dupriest, and John Mark Hopper, I worked for him on the fish farm, he was my sand crew boss.

Chief Peckat: Did they admit to you that he had done that to them?
