 1. **DBHA completed development on Saratoga Crossings III, adding another 75 units of new housing. Fifteen of the units are PBV units for the elderly. Twelve are PBCA units for persons with mental illness.**
 2. **DBHA currently has real estate under contract to develop another new housing complex in excess of ninety units and includes 8 PBV for veterans in the city of Sunrise, FL.**
 3. **The agency applied for and received 10 VASH vouchers and 79 Mainstream vouchers.**
 4. **Changed our program management software. The new software has portals for both the landlords and participants to provide easier processes for annual recertifications, interim changes, inspections, rent increase requests, etc.**
