Subsequent personal approaches to the Chief Executives of several majors to open dialogue included Balfour Beatty, Carillion, Kier, Interserve, Amey, Galliford Try, and Costain – were all rejected. The subsequent demise or near demise of numerous contractors has received even better publicity in the ensuing five years, while European Majors regularly compete on the largest UK infrastructure projects. However, if CN would like to reassess why the UK construction sector Civils Companies remain lacklustre, in comparison with their European counterparts, I'd be happy to contribute my input.

The rhetoric remains that, perhaps not surprisingly - most company executives appear more 'precious' about their companies' independence, and their own jobs, than perhaps they are the best interests of their shareholders, employees, and clients.
