For unsurgered results, it's essential for us in the business of beauty to understand natural facial proportions, and how an addition or subtraction of certain facial subunits harmonizes the whole.

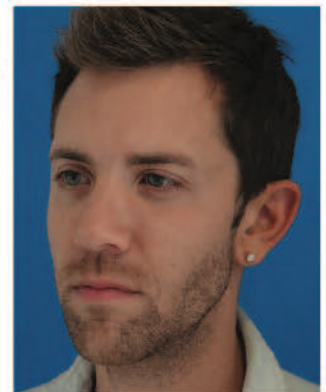
FILLERS

Subtle and significant differences are the goal while maintaining a natural look. While it is true that some fillers are temporary, newer forms such as Voluma may last years. Fat grafting and Sculptra are permanent."

WITH current interviews on nightly news and entertainment talk shows, Beverly Hills Plastic Surgeon Dr. Tim Neavin is front row and center with opinions on the business of beauty. Emerging from the winter slump most likely all of us are ready for a little something to spark up our look for spring and summer. I have long been a believer in the art and science of plastic surgery to fight the aging process. These days, however, as I look around what concerns me is the wave of unnatural results walking the streets. I don't think I'm alone in this observation. Are these results from surgery-gone-wrong, bad judgement on the part of a doctor, or is what we see defining a moment in time when the standard of beauty as we have known it has changed? I sat down with Dr. Neavin for answers.

ST: The more we look the more we see distorted faces that look less "ageless" and more "frightful." What's up with the puffy, pulled to the brink of explosion faces, huge unnatural lips and squinty looking eyes? Don't people have mirrors in their homes any more?

TN: Something tells me there's no shortage of mirrors in LA. That's not the problem. Most people who have plastic surgery don't look unnatural, fake, or as you described, "distorted" or "frightful". Results such as the ones you're talking about represent a small minority of the plastic surgery consumer population. Even though there does exist an "addicting" element to plastic surgery, most surgeons know when to put on the brakes and most patients are receptive to a professional
