LID, Cont'd:

Looking to the future, fortunately there is some good news. The state of Minnesota has created a structure that includes all property owners in solutions to chronic water problems. This structure is available to us. It is:

- A structure that provides predictable and sustainable funding
- A structure that addresses the three issues as "chronic" rather than "acute"
- A structure that protects our economic assets: *cleaner, stabilized water means higher property values*
- A structure that provides for shared financial responsibility as well as shared benefits
- A structure that requires property owner participation

The Structure: <u>A Briggs Lake Chain Improvement District [LID]</u>

What is a Lake Improvement District [LID]?

A LID is created by county government [Sherburne County] to provide the structure and opportunity for greater landowner involvement in lake management activities.

What can a LID do?

By law, LIDs can, for example:

Acquire, construct and operate a dam or other water level control structure / Undertake research projects, Conduct projects of water improvement and conservation / Construct and maintain water and sewer systems, Serve as local sponsors for state and federal projects and grants / Regulate water surface use

Examples of activities other LIDs in Minnesota were formed for:

Construction and maintenance of a lake outlet	Flood control outlets and structures
Lake level stabilization project	Aquatic plant management
Water quality monitoring and research	Sanitary sewer management

The BLCA Board of Directors decided several years ago to explore having a Briggs Chain Lake Improvement District. With the latest high water event in June and July 2013, and the ensuing low water event, the Board determined this was a good time to introduce a LID for the chain of lakes. A LID will not solve our chronic lake issues, but it will provide a better suited structure to effectively address them. A LID does not replace the lake association but provides an effective, sustainably funded structure to keep what we have **and** improve the water quality and stabilization of the entire chain. And in doing so, improve our property values. It will most importantly create a positive legacy for the next generation.

<u>There is a lot to learn about a LID, and work to do before its formation</u>. *How is it formed? Who manages it? How is it funded? And more.* Stay tuned for more information from the Lake Report, BLCA website, special mailings and informational meetings.
