Join us for the Candlelight Vigil Thursday, October 15 at 6:30 pm

October is Domestic Violence Prevention Month. While there will be a number of events to highlight domestic violence, we at SCAN want to underscore the fact that domestic violence between spouses and partners can also physically (and definitely emotionally) hurt and kill children. Each October, SCAN and other community partners conduct a Candlelight Vigil to provide awareness of and to honor the North Carolina children who died as a result of abuse the previous year.

Child fatalities are the most tragic consequences of child abuse and neglect. While all deaths from abuse and neglect should be counted, NC child homicides by a parent or caregiver are those by abuse only. Those deaths resulting from neglect remain uncounted, making the problem seem smaller than it actually is.

The ultimate goal of SCAN is to prevent child abuse and neglect. Promoting safe, nurturing relationships as well as safe, nurturing environments are both crucial for prevention. SCAN teaches positive parenting skills, effective communication skills and appropriate discipline techniques while providing support to parents as they learn. SCAN also advocates for appropriate and timely physical health visits and the importance of meeting a child's emotional needs.

The Candlelight Vigil will be held at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church at 225 Morgan Street, Troutman. It will begin at 6:30 pm. I hope you will join us as we honor these little ones and as we re-commit to continue our prevention efforts.
