Rules for Western, English, Hunter and Jumper Horse Show

GENERAL RULES:

1. No dogs allowed.
2. All riders are required to sign a liability waiver before they ride.
3. All horses must pass a health inspection before they enter any arena. An on-site veterinarian will provide this inspection at no cost to the participants.
4. All competitors must register at the registration table before entering any classes.
5. Competitor number will follow horse and rider combination.
6. A junior rider is one who is 17 years of age or younger as of January 1, 2018.
7. Three announcements will be made for each class. The entry gate will be closed following the third announcement and late riders will not be allowed into the arena. Registration fees will not be refunded.
8. Riding helmets with chinstraps must be worn when schooling and showing over jumps. Protective headgear is always recommended whenever riding.
9. Boots with adequate heel required.
10. No martingales or tie downs will be allowed in any flat class or hunter over fences class.
11. No tendon boots, polo-wraps, bell boots or other protective leg wear will be allowed.
12. In all jumping classes, rider with three refusals will be eliminated from that class.
13. Standard 4-H rules will apply, except that any USEF approved bit is allowed for any age horse
14. In case of bad weather, the organizers reserve the right to alter and/or cancel classes.
15. The organizers and property owners will not be responsible for loss or damage to persons or property.

WALK/TROT DIVISION:

Open to all riders of any discipline. May be split between adults and juniors at show management discretion.

To be judged on the rider's form, overall position and balance seat. Prizes will be awarded for each class and the division.

Riders entering this class may not be judged in any other class. They may enter in other classes as an audit/ride for experience only.

Equitation Under Saddle: (class 25) To be judged on the rider's form, overall position and balanced seat.

Hunter Under Saddle: (class 26) To be judged on the performance, form and movement of the horse

Pile of Poles: (class 27) Riding over a set course of 8 poles on the ground, to be judged on the performance, form and movement of the horse

PLEASURE DIVISION:

To be judged on the obedience and manageability of the horse.

Participants will be divided as Adults and Juniors. Prizes will be awarded for each class and each division.

Western Pleasure Division: Adult (classes 1,2,3) and Junior (classes 4,5,6)

Pleasure walk, jog and lope, lope both directions of the arena

Bridle Path Hack walk, jog and lope both directions of the arena; may be asked to extend the lope, halt, back-up, dismount and remount

Trail Course course will be set outside of the main show ring; can be entered at rider's available time between 9AM and 1PM. Separate judge will be utilized

English Pleasure Division: Adult (classes 7,8,9) and Junior (classes 10,11,12)

Pleasure walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena

Bridle Path Hack walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena, may be asked to hand gallop, halt, back-up, dismount and remount

Pleasure Hack walk, trot and canter: after rail work is completed, each rider will jump two cross rails individually

HUNTER DIVISION:

To be judged on the performance, form and movement of the horse both on the flat and over a set course of jumps. A different course will be set for each jumping class round 1 and round 2.

Before the Under Saddle Classes start, each rider must designate one height class on which to be judged. Only one height class will be judged, the other may be entered as an audit/ride for experience only.

Low Hunter Division (cross rails) includes 1 under saddle class and 2 over fences classes. Participants will be divided as Adults and Juniors. Prizes will be awarded for each class and for each division.

High Hunter Division (2'3"-2'6") includes 1 under saddle class and 2 over fences class. Participants are combined regardless of age and judged together. Prizes will be awarded for each class and for the division.

Low Hunter Division: Adult (classes 13,14,15) and Junior (classes 16,17,18)

Low Hunter Under Saddle	walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena
Low Hunter Over Fences rounds 1 and 2	riding over a set course of 8-10 jumps

High Hunter Division: (classes 19,20,21)

High Hunter Under Saddle	walk, trot and canter both directions of the arena
High Hunter Over Fences rounds 1 and 2	riding over a set course of 8-10 jumps

JUMPER DIVISION:

Adult and Junior participants are combined and judged together in both classes. Prizes will be awarded for each class and the division.

Jumper 2'3"-2'6".

Power and Speed: (class 22) set course of 8 jumps: if completed without faults, continue without stopping over jumps 9-13 against the clock

Table 2 section 2b: (class 23) set course of 8-10 jumps: if completed without faults, wait for judge's whistle then complete a different jump off course against the clock

Gamblers Choice: (class 24) not a set course of jumps, each jump will have a point value. Jumps may be jumped in any order, each jump may only be jumped twice, points will only count if jumped clean, knocked down jumps will not be reset within that round. Most points accumulated in set time wins. If a tie occurs, a joker fence will be designated to jump as the tie breaker.

September 8 Saddle Mountain Ranch, 23760 US Highway 40, Steamboat Springs

Time Schedule:

Facility Gates Open at 7:30

Registration Opens at 7:30 and will remain open until the Hunter Division is complete

Controlled Schooling from 8:00 to 8:45 AM and during a 30-minute break following the Walk/Trot Division

Entry Fees: \$10 per class, not to exceed \$25 per division, per rider

Each participant must submit registration form, equine certificate of health form from our on-site veterinarian and activity release form prior to riding

Registration will be on-site. All forms will be available at the registration table

An on-site veterinarian will provide this inspection at no cost to the participants

English participants are encouraged to wear horse show attire or shirts with a collar.

Western participants are encouraged to wear western attire

Ribbons and Prizes will be offered for each show:

Classes: First through 6th place ribbons will be presented as participants leave the arena.

1st=6 points, 2nd=5 points, 3rd=4 points, 4th=3 points, 5th=2 points, 6th=1 point

Divisions: Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons + entry fee gift certificates will be awarded as soon as scores are totaled

In the event of a tie the rider who scored the highest total points in the following will determine placing:

English – Over Fences Classes

Western – Trail Course

High Point at Show: Champion and Reserve Champion Ribbons will be awarded as soon as scores are totaled

Series: Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Ribbons will be awarded at the completion of the Sept show.

Points will be cumulative from both shows.
