Town of Stratton Selectmen's Meeting

October 26, 2020

Present: Selectmen: Al Dupell – Chair, Larry Bills, Chris Liller, Greg Marcucci and Kevin Robinson; and Clerk – Kent Young.

Al Dupell called the meeting to order at 7:30pm at the Stratton Town Office. Orders were reviewed and signed. No modifications to the Agenda were made.

Road Crew Issues: Signage: The Selectmen reviewed a request to improve signage at the W. Jamaica Rd. / Mountain Rd. intersection, as often that turn to the resort is missed by traffic, which then turns around at the nearest driveway. Chris Liller will consider improving the signage there. The Board concurred. Supplemental Aid Grant: The State issued said grant to all towns. Stratton received \$22,938.00. The Treasurer had asked where the Selectmen would like to apply these funds. The Board will decide during the budget meeting, whether to apply it to Bridges or to Equipment. The Road Foreman stated that no other grants will be awarded for the coming year and so the board discussed delaying paving and other potential projects for the year. The Foreman also said that the Better Roads Program, however, will be funded this year to cover acceptable grants for applicable road improvements. Snowmobile Road usage: The Selectmen agreed to allow said usage with no changes from the previous year - 1) Stratton-Arlington Rd. from Grout Pond Rd. to the Sunderland town line, 2) Grout Pond Rd., 3) Canedy Rd., 4) Ball Farm Rd., 5) Old Town Rd. and 6) Shepardson Rd.

Budget Meeting: The Selectmen agreed to hold the annual budget meeting at their regular meeting of December 14, 2020. They also agreed to include a requested \$250.00 appropriation from Vermont Family Network to be included in the Appropriations Article of the Town Meeting Warning.

Minutes: Greg Marcucci moved to approve the Selectmen's Minutes of October 12, 2020. Kevin Robinson seconded. The minutes were approved.

Adjourn: Greg Marcucci motioned to adjourn at 7:50p.m.. Kevin Robinson seconded. All were in favor and the meeting adjourned.
