Music

Music is a universal source of fun, challenge and imagination which can be accessed by all ages, cultures and abilities. At Hopping Hill, we aim to provide a high-quality music education that engages and inspires pupils to develop a life-long love of music and their talent as musicians. We hope to increase their self-confidence, creativity and sense of achievement. Through learning to play instruments, singing and responding to music, we aim to develop each child's musical potential.

At Hopping Hill, music is taught throughout the school as a discrete class subject using the Charanga music scheme. Music is also used to enhance other curriculum subjects. Children have a variety of opportunities to learn songs and sing as part of a choir or small group.

In Year 3, children are given the opportunity to learn a tuned instrument and instrumental tuition is available to all children in Key Stage two. These children are taught individually or in small groups - parents are required to meet the cost. Those who play instruments are encouraged to utilise their skills in school by joining the school orchestra and playing in concerts.
