Seven persons were present for the meeting. Lisa reported Helen is in fragile health and not able to attend anymore.

I reported we have \$5,400 in our bank account, which includes \$1,000 dedicated to a Raymond bridge rail project (still incomplete), and \$1500 for Parker Hills Vicksburg talks into a video.

At a future meeting Lisa will speak about her Vicksburg tour with Parker Hills.

Rob Orr will present to us in May about Civil War music.

I shared a newspaper clipping about "Slave Tags", and pictures of some. When slaves were purchased in Africa, they were given a metal tag with a number and the owner's name. If they were caught without their tag, they would be severely punished. I had never heard of this before, I had recently attended a Black History event in Tulare.

Our program was a video on the Battle of Franklin. It was one of the best we have ever seen, as it had a historical narrative, with battle scenes taken from Franklin re-enactments, with not a couple dozen participants, but thousands of them! During parts of the battle,

a narrator read quotes from soldier's diaries or letters. Also featured were actual buildings on the battlefield.

From "The Blue & Gray Laughing"

Unfortunately, images transmitted via the internet seldom survive to be published. Nevertheless, I will describe one from the book in Harper's Weekly, 6/22/1861: A CSA coin features a bank supported on the backs of a couple of slaves, and a confederate pointing a pistol at a gentleman presenting a bill. The coin's lettering states: "OWE EVER—PAY NEVER". Apparently this is satire on the poor state of the CSA economy and banking.
