Geography

Through the Hopping Hill curriculum, geography encourages pupils to think more about the world around them. Using a mixture of fieldwork, technology and research skills to enrich their understanding, children from Year 1 to Year 6 are given the opportunity to understand their place within our own community and the wider world. Our aims in our geography curriculum are to inspire and encourage our pupils understanding of the world around them.

Geography is taught from Years 1 to 6. Each year group studies three units, each taught for half a term. Geography is a discrete subject but links are made with other subjects when relevant, particularly History and Science. Each unit of study, which is based on the Focus Learning Challenge Curriculum, aims to teach children key geographical skills, using a range of maps, atlases, globes and technology. Aspects of Geography are also taught through our Early Years curriculum under the strand 'Understanding the world' through continuous provision.
