Pastor's Corner

This past month I went snow tubing on the slopes at Boyce park not once but TWICE (so *there* anyone who thinks I'm too old for such stuff – ok, honestly I may just be saying that to myself). The more recent was with the youth group, when even though it was only 20° F. and it was actually *snowing*, they had their snowmakers blowing fabricated snow into the air over the slopes, so it was, well, “a bit much” someone would say, but we had fun. The time before that – a great test run for the youth outing – I went with my daughter, Renee, and future son-in-law, Michael, who visited the first week of January. It was a delight. Michael had never seen snow, let alone ridden down it at 20 mph! Seeing a 6 foot, 220+lb. man laugh like a child was glorious. There is a perfect word for it ... joy. It reminded me of a quote by C.S. Lewis (don't worry, it's a short one): “One day you will be old enough to start reading fairy tales again.” Of course, the context of his words implies that we can sometimes wall ourselves off to the wonder of the world with very “adult-ish” things and what we think is an “adult-ish” way of thinking.

And sometimes we can be confused by the Bible because on the one hand Jesus says that we must have the faith of a child if we are to receive the kingdom of God (Mark 10:15) ... but Paul also tells us in his letters (1 Corinthians 13:11 and Ephesians

4) that we are not to remain little children (spiritually) but to grow to maturity. So, what's the “aspect” of child-like faith that we are to keep, even as we leave child-ish ways behind us? Many great Christian teachers have offered insight – it could mean: 1) the kind of reliance, trust, and dependence on God that children have on their adult family members, 2) the kind of humility that is often displayed by little children, 3) the kind of fluid creative imagination children often display almost effortlessly in contrast to the “hardened” ways of adult thinking. Of course, it is likely a combination of these things, but the one I'd like to focus on here, is the sense of “wonder” at God's world.

Children are more tapped into this kind of joy. Little children have a kind of refreshing “indifference” to worldly things (power, influence, money, security). They are far more interested – and *can see much more clearly* – the fingerprints of the divine in the world around them. They are more suited and ready to celebrate this overflowing goodness that is spilling over from God's creative hands all the time. Michael had tapped into this kind of joy. Lewis, somewhere else, said that being ‘humble’ isn't about thinking less about yourself ... it's about getting to the point where you don't really think about yourself at all ... because you're fully in the moment and enjoying the people and circumstances around you with no ulterior motive ... A child has not yet “learned” to discover the importance of herself. Oh, to forego that as long as possible! This kind of humility – not worrying about yourself but fully present to what God is doing – is what leads to joy. What's the use of *pride or position* to a child; they want to get on with the ‘business’ of experiencing the wonders around them, for all their worth – this is the best kind of warm up for worship in my opinion. And this is the frame of mind I desire for all of us at Puckety as we go about our stated mission this year to “Honor God (*joyfully*), Grow in faith (*joyfully*), and improve our world (*joyfully*).”

"The Lord has been our strength and sustainer in every season. We humbly ask for your continued prayers regarding several pressing needs:

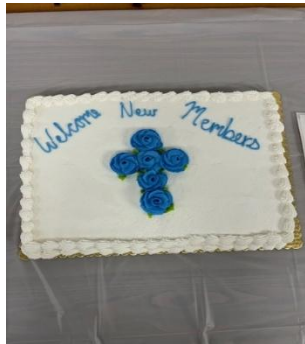

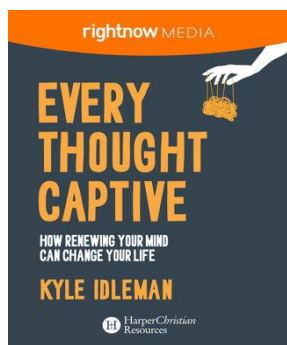

### **A Devotional for You** – Read *1 Corinthians 1:10-13 ... AND 1 Corinthians 12:12-20*

Many of you know that we are now in a sermon series on Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians. I wanted to share something in my first sermon but there wasn’t space, and since it is also connected to the portion of the letter where we may end the series, I think it would fit perfectly here, because it connects the themes of unity and the church as the Body of Christ. Using the analogy of the human body, there are some diseases that can spread infection throughout the body of Christ. The mind can become swollen with pride. The heart can grow cold and indifferent because of sin. The digestive system can get clogged by sterile theory and unapplied theology, so the body can’t digest what needs to be turned into energy or eliminate what needs to be released. When that occurs, we start to fight among ourselves, or we lose our equilibrium and find ourselves unable to stay balanced.

Paul Brand writes this in his book, *Fearfully and Wonderfully Made* (try to discern the spiritual connections in the life of the church): “Sometimes a dreaded thing occurs in the body – a mutiny - resulting in a tumor. A tumor is called benign if its effect is fairly localized and it stays within its membrane boundaries. But the most traumatizing condition in the body occurs when disloyal cells defy inhibition. They multiply without any checks on growth, spreading rapidly throughout the body, choking out normal cells. White cells, armed against foreign invaders, will not attack the body’s own mutinous cells. Physicians fear no other malfunction more deeply: it is called cancer. For still mysterious reasons, these cells grow wild, out of control. In a way, each is a “fully-functioning” cell, but disloyal, no longer acting in regard for the rest of the body. Even the white cells, the dependable palace guard, can destroy the body through rebellion. Sometimes they recklessly reproduce, clogging the bloodstream, strangling the body’s normal functions.

Because I am a surgeon – not a prophet – I tremble to make the analogy between cancer in the physical body and mutiny in the spiritual body of Christ. But I must. In his warnings to the church (both in the Gospels and in the early chs. of Revelation), Jesus was not worried about the shocks and bruises His Body would meet from external forces – “the gates of hell shall not prevail against my Church” (Matthew 16:18) – but He cried out against the kind of disloyalty that comes from within (Matthew 24:5, 10-13; Rev. 3:1-3, 17-19). As a result, few doctrines are more important than this one – our unity in Christ. Because the church is under constant attack, we cannot afford a civil war in our own spiritual body. Because we are fellow members of this vital spiritual organism, we need to apply ourselves to mutual harmony. And because disease can diminish the effectiveness of the body, we must maintain habits (personal and collective disciplines) for health, and a consistent program of “exercise” in harmony with God’s healthcare for us.
