From the Pastor...

I thought this newsletter might be a good time to catch up on a few things prior to the fall. Summer is not a slow time around here and I was reminded that there are probably things happening that the congregation may not be as aware of as the rest of the church staff.

So I want to title the beginning of this article: **Did you know?**

- ▶ That there is a member family that has given funds to the church for special uses. The fund is administered by the DeVries family and me, the pastor. We call it the St. Paul's fund. It has enabled us to help fund the vicar's trip to Germany. It has paid a portion of the new security camera system, paid our portion of the new Triangle area Lutheran Church's marketing campaign, given to Ukrainian Relief, Stephen Ministry, Durham Sr. Life Center, special musicians funding and several other projects. This is a gift and blessing to the congregation.
- ▶ Wildflower Cottage passed all their inspections and will move to their new home beginning August 25.
- ▶ We have a new piece of art on the wall in the Atrium. It is "outsider art," folk art from an African American artist from Texas. It features the last supper with Jesus and the disciples as people of color (most likely a very accurate portrayal of them). Come and see this new art. Thanks CCG for the suggestion.
- ▶ We will plan to pound the new vicar the first two Sundays in August. (August 7 and 14). Things to bring are household supplies, gift cards to area stores (Target, Walmart, Harris Teeter, Wegmans, etc.) We want to welcome Vicar Amanda well.
- ▶ We will be keeping the spaces that Wildflower occupied vacant for the most part until early in 2023. That doesn't mean we won't use those spaces, it means we won't designate any of them for a permanent new use for a little while, as we figure the best use of those spaces.
- ▶ Until this round of Covid surge slows, we will continue to ask people to maintain social distancing in the sanctuary and masks are still optional.
- ▶ 2023 is our 100th anniversary and we are looking for people to work on the committee to plan activities.
- ▶ The major gift to Duke Lutherans is complete and so this ministry needs financial support if we are to continue this vital ministry. Currently we have

about 2 years of funding left in their account and are working diligently to raise more funding.

Many of these items have been in the works for some time and will continue to be kept in the forefront of our life together.

We are hoping to begin with Rally Day (September 11), two services and Sunday School. We are also hoping to begin Wednesday night meals again in September with a special Oktoberfest in October. I am beginning to plan a Martin Luther birthday party on November 9th (the day before Martin's birthday), so be on the lookout for this event.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Hello! My name is Amanda Spangler, and I am excited to be joining you on August 16 as your 2022-2023 vicar. I have gotten to know a little bit about you all through conversations with Pastor Scott and Vicar Mac, as well as your internship site materials you provided to Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. I want to let you know a little about me in return!

I am a native of Alabama and grew up in the tail end of Appalachia. I have a diverse denominational background, but I was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Wanting to meet Lutherans under the age of 45, I went to Valparaiso University in Valparaiso, Indiana, where I studied German and theology. My German is a little rusty, but I remember it quickly when given opportunities to practice, so I hope to meet some fellow German-speakers!

While at Valpo, I became a deaconess student with the Lutheran Diaconal Association, and I was consecrated by that diaconate in 2010. By that time I had moved my membership to the ELCA congregation in which I was serving, and I have been a member of the ELCA since 2009.

After serving in parish ministry for three years, I moved from Ohio to Chicago for graduate studies at Loyola University Chicago, where I obtained a Master of Arts in biblical languages and literature. I took a year to have a quarter-life crisis and work at an academic library, then began serving at a congregation in Tennessee. Following the end of my time there, I moved to Athens, Georgia, and began work at a congregation there. I learned that the kind of ministry I wanted to do really required further training, so I enrolled at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, from which I graduated in May with a Master of

Divinity.

I am a candidate for Word and Sacrament ministry in the Southeastern synod. This is a little confusing since I will still remain a deaconess regardless of my possible status as an ordained Minister of Word and Sacrament. This is because my diaconate is an independent Lutheran organization, which has many different Lutheran denominations represented. There are a number of women in my community who are “Reverend Deacs,” women who have been wonderful mentors and models for me. I hope to continue the work they’ve begun in holding together the principles of Word and Service within the Ministry of Word and Sacrament.

Other fun trivia: I am butler to a 14-year-old tortoise shell (torti) cat named Pi (not the mathematical symbol – ask me!) who is full of sass. I also provide entertainment for a two-and-a-half-year-old pittie named Percy, who is a blanket hog and a hardcore snuggler. He also has a fan club of stray cats that accompany us on walks. I like crafting, and will dabble in anything creative, though I am skilled in crochet. I also play the ukulele, though I confess I picked it up just because it irritated a friend of mine – I’ve since grown to love it, though I’m by no means proficient. I like mountains and beaches, margaritas and tap water, hiking and reading. If I have to exercise, I prefer swimming. The hardest part of moving to Durham for one year is leaving behind 90% of my books, but I know you all will be worth the temporary separation.

I look forward to meeting you in person soon!
