# Why Church?

This fall we have been looking at the importance of the church to our individual lives, our families, and our communities by asking the question "Why Church?" Why do we need this gathering, especially in a time when people can be so divided and isolated.

In every church, there will be moments of disagreement. Whether it's over how a ministry should be run, personal preferences in worship, or differing theological views, we are bound to encounter differences. But, as followers of Christ, we are called to something greater than our differences—we are called to unity. The early church faced similar challenges. In Acts 15, we see a significant disagreement arise among the apostles and early Christians regarding the conversion of Gentiles. Some believed that Gentile converts must follow the Mosaic law, particularly circumcision, while others believed that faith in Christ alone was sufficient. This issue had the potential to deeply divide the early believers. Yet, instead of allowing this disagreement to cause division, they came together to seek God's will and to discern how they could best move forward in unity. Through prayer, discussion, and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, they found a solution that honored both Jewish tradition and the new freedom found in Christ.

This section of Scripture reminds us that even in disagreement, we can seek unity. The apostles didn't avoid or ignore their differences, but they engaged in respectful dialogue, relying on God's wisdom to guide them. They recognized that the mission of proclaiming the Gospel was too important to allow division to take root. Similarly, in 1 Corinthians 12, Paul speaks about the Body of Christ, reminding us that we are all different members of the same body. Each member plays a unique role, but we are united under one head—Jesus Christ. Paul writes,

"For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ" 1 Corinthians 12:12

Our diversity is not something to fear but to embrace. Each of us has a different gift, a different calling, and a different perspective. Yet, we are all essential to the health and function of the church. In a world that increasingly celebrates division, we, the Church, must stand as a beacon of unity. Our differences in opinion, background, and resources should not cause us to pull apart but to come together, recognizing that we are united in the love of Christ. Our mission is not about proving who is right or wrong in matters of preference or secondary issues, but about sharing the Good News of Jesus with a world that desperately needs hope.

As we seek to live out our faith together, let us remember the example of the early church in Acts 15 and the teaching of Paul in 1 Corinthians 12. Let us embrace our differences, knowing that they make us stronger when we work in harmony. And

most importantly, let us remain united in our mission to proclaim Christ's love to the world. In Christ, we are one. Let us never lose sight of that truth, even in the midst of differences.






# **How Do I Give to the Church** and Its Ministries


