From the EMS Captain Desk Jeff Bridges, they worked to get three new EMT PRN Employees added. This will save money on our payroll budget. Grant process is moving forward as planned. Jeff submitted a quote for a Horton ambulance. COVID-19: No new news. Continue recommended hand washing, hand sanitizing and mask wearing.

Police Chief has been busy sending out letters for city ordinance violations including high grass and weeds. Sgt. West is currently taking online police courses. Chief Scott will be taking the class "Why Teens Kill". It has been rescheduled for August.
