The Theology of Baseball

Friends, as I ponder the end of another dismal Rockies season, and while I recognize that I may be the only baseball fan left in Denver, I still cannot hate the game. Baseball is in my blood and never more so than now, as we approach the World Series (go Dodgers). So, if you will allow me, I would like to share an old blog I wrote in August of 2022, explaining my love of the game and a little bit about the theology of baseball...

There have been many books written about it. Jonathan Fink's trilogy, *The Baseball Gods* are *Real* is fun, as is John Sexton's *Baseball as a Road to God: Seeing Beyond the Game*. So

much has been written on the theology of baseball that if you google it, you will receive 25,000,000 results. In books, articles and Sunday sermons, the faithful have poetically pondered the similarities between our ideas of religion and our enjoyment of baseball. Whenever I attend a baseball game, I find myself doing the same thing.

Today, after a satisfying Rockies win [remember, I wrote this in August of 2022], I wiped the sweat from my face, pulled my damp shirt away from my body and wondered how the players find it in themselves to play day after day, down there on the hot, breezeless field, in uniforms, with no shade, and no hope of making the playoffs, let alone winning the World Series. Later that evening, I shared my thoughts with my beloved, and he replied, "But they show up, don't they?!"

Yeah they do!

A few clergy colleagues and I have a support group that mixes business with pleasure at Coors Field. The game is our venue for self-care, camaraderie, and wisdom sharing. During the drive to and from the ballpark, and while we are in the "cathedral" on Blake Street, we check in with one another (like greeting time at the beginning of worship), offer one another sage advice (never as long as a sermon), and sing together the hymns of our meeting house: The Star-Spangled Banner and of course, Take Me Out to the Ballgame. And if I may digress just one moment here, friends, the words are "Take me out with the crowd," not "to the crowd," and it is "Crackerjack" not "Crackerjacks." Just sayin'.

Once a month, we show up to root, root, root for the Rockies. We stay for the whole game. We encourage, cheer, chat, and revel in the well-executed double play. We admire the courage of players who dive for the ball, giving over their entire being to the mission of the catch. We cheer wildly for the miraculous throw to the plate, and stand in awe of the home run hit deep into the center field bleachers. It is inspirational at best and, even on the worst days, provides moments of pure joy.

Then when all hope of ultimate success is lost for the season, when attendance is down and the boo-birds (as Vin Scully used to call them) are out in full force, the true fan is revealed. We begin planning for the next season. We fondly remember the joy of seasons past to keep hope alive for the future. We keep our eye on how to improve the team, on what changes need to be made to get 'em next year. And we continue to show up.

Isn't that what every church is going through right now? Trying to keep hope alive for the future and continuing to learn how to improve and shift to better fulfill our mission in these changing times? We could learn a lot from the players on the field and from the faithful who continue to show up, engage, and give their all for a common cause. In baseball, it is to win the game for the team. In faith, it is to win hearts for the love of God. Both require dedication, skill, teamwork and perseverance, and the ability to weather the

bad years without giving up.

I pray we keep showing up, keep our eye on what is important, and keep finding inspiration and joy in the simple pleasures of life. And to continue my homage to Vin Scully and baseball, "Here's wishing you a very pleasant good afternoon — wherever you may be."


