Free Help with Taxes Thursday, April 6, 10am-5pm

Each year, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs offer free, faceto-face tax help to people with low-tomoderate income. IRS-tax law certified volunteers provide free service with electronic filing to all people who qualify. What to bring: proof of Identification (photo ID); Social Security cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for you, your spouse, and/or dependents; proof of foreign status, if applying for an ITIN; birthdates for all on the tax return; for married filing jointly, both spouses must be present; all Forms W-2, W-2G, 1099 and 1098; a copy of last year's federal and state returns; proof of bank account and routing information if choosing direct deposit of refund (e.g. voided check); total paid to daycare provider and their tax ID; health insurance exemption certificate, if received; all Forms 1095 Health Insurance statements. A Perspective of A Lost Lady Rachel Olsen, The National Willa **Cather Center**


Thursday, April 13, 2pm




