From the Minister's Mac

66Grief⁹⁹

Try as we might, we can't get away from the harsh reality that no one lives forever. At least, not here on earth. We do everything we can to stay young, to hide our aging, to keep active, and to exercise not only our bodies, but also our minds. We do what we can to prolong our wonderful lives, but no matter what we do, we eventually have to face the hard fact that death comes for us all.

The thing is, grief is a common experience, so common, in fact, that every year I hold a Blue Christmas Service, where folks who have lost a loved one might find a safe place to celebrate the birth of Christ, a place where tears may flow while carols are being sung, and where friends are there to hug and pray with those who have a hard time finding that joyous noel. (This year's Blue Christmas Service will be on Tuesday, December 16 at 7pm.)

We need such a service because grief is always with us and makes the holidays especially hard. We find ourselves struggling to get through the days, with humps to get over, gatherings to endure, treatments to survive, and family dramas to navigate. We find ourselves in a constant tug-of-war between a need to remain present and a desire to just run away. Because of our sorrow, we can't imagine a Holly Jolly Christmas and maybe we don't even want to. And that's okay! It's okay to run away and hide, and forget all about the accourrements of the holidays in order to focus on and deal with our grief.

Its okay to run away and hide from everything except for one tiny thing. One tiny baby — Jesus, God's gift to the world. Christmas is really about how much God loves us and we DON'T want to hide from that. EVER!

We may have the Blue Christmas service at Christmas time, but we need to remember to cling to Jesus every day. We need to continually celebrate our God who keeps trying to connect with humanity, through angels and prophets and kings, and yes, through the baby named Jesus.

Jesus is our hope for a better tomorrow, hope for the kingdom of God on earth, hope for one day without violence, one day without pain, one day without tears, one day without more bad news. Jesus is our hope to recognize that the joy we find in him any day of the year is not about being happy or jolly. It is about finding that peace that surpasses all understanding, the peace that comes only from our loving God through Jesus the Christ.

I pray that whenever grief is experienced in our community, we can share that hope and peace with one another, and find comfort in knowing that we are not alone in our sorrow. Thanks be to God!

Noah's Community Outreach

You PROBABLY know Noah's Community Outreach collects clothing and hygiene items throughout the year, to distribute (in backpacks) to people in our community who are unhoused. Right now we are prepping for winter, buying sleeping bags and watching for sales on warm clothing, socks, etc. Last year we distributed 37-ish backpacks; this coming year we hope to distribute 50 or more.

You MAY know Noah's Community Outreach provides Saturday night supper, twice a month, for people who stay overnight in the Hope for Longmont shelter (usually about 30 guests).

You MAY NOT know - we are now partnering with Hope for Longmont to provide lunches throughout the week. Hope for Longmont serves 300 lunches each month at their food bank location, and another 100 as their outreach team meets people around town who need and will accept support. Each week, we provide supplies like sandwiches, snacks, drinks, and fruit for them to distribute. This week we took them some hard-boiled eggs! We by no means meet the entire need, but we are helping.

Noah's Community Outreach receives some grant funding from Rinn UMC, and is also supported by donations in time, resources, and \$ from the congregation.
