GRAND COUNTY SPECIAL SERVICE DISTRICT
Regular Meeting ----- September 20, 1988

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, ATTENDANCE
D. L. Taylor at the District Office at 7:00 A.M. Other
Grand County Water Conservancy District members present were
Gary Wilson, Stan Baker, John "Dutch" Zimmerman, John Groo
and James Walker.

Grand County Special Service District members
present were D.L. Taylor, Gary Wilson, George White, Dan
Holyoak and William D. McDougald.

Others present were Carroll Clark, Deloy Lance,
Dale Pierson and Roberta Highland.

Roberta read the minutes of the meeting of Septem- MINUTES
ber 6, 1988. After calling for additions or corrections and
hearing none, the Chair declared the minutes be approved as
read.

Carroll Clark reported that M.I.C. wanted a meas- MOAB IRRIGA-
uring device at Walnut Lane, one at the Phillips 66 station TION CO.
at Highway 191 off 5th West, and one at Red Rock Elementary.
There are 5 called for in the contract. Dale asked about
the pipe size at the Phillips Station, because if the pipe
does not run full, it can not be measured accurately. The
system in general was discussed and Carroll Clark described
the pipes on M.I.C. system. Clark stated he felt the first
priority is measuring points at Walnut Lane and at 5th West
& the Highway. Points of placement and accuracy of the
devices was discussed. D. L. pointed out that Parschall
Flumes could be moved. James Walker stated he felt the
first necessity was to measure at Red Rock Elementary, and
felt this device should be put in this fall. He will meet
with the full board on the other delivery points. The
repairs needed for the Diversion Dam was discussed, and
Walker pointed out the dam is leaking, and asked if the SCS
could do a study as to costs, and stated they would call
Kedrick to see if he could help out. Deloy stated the Salt
Lake office of USGS would charge for a study. Walker will
call on Kedrick Somerville at the SCS for a second opinion
and get back to the Board so action can be taken this fall.

Walker asked if anything is being done about the
contract call for water in a dry season. Dale reported the
wells had delivered just under 3 cfs. Walker proposed
looking at and consider acquiring more wells. Perhaps the
Districts rights could be transferred to the Deloy and Hance
wells, and consider pumping Byrd's well, and feels Dale
should be looking into acquiring more pumping capacity, and
perhaps the District could consider getting a grant to
enlarge the two mountain lakes, Oowah in particular, for
additional storage. Warner could be enlarged for storage
for a dry year, and there might be less evaporation up
there.

After a brief discussion, James Walker moved to JOINT OWNER-approve the proposed Agreement for Joint Ownership contract. SHIP CONTRACT
Dutch seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

The Rattle claim was discussed. Dale reported PAUL RATTLE
that there are three things the District can do, 1. pay CLAIM
the claim. 2. Answer the claim. or 3. do nothing, and if
we do nothing for 90 days, the claim is deemed denied. Dale
reported Rattle seems to be hinging his claim at the moment,
on the fact that overirrigation in the valley is causing the
problem. Our application for a grant to meter all irriga-
tion water use will give the District more control. Dan
Holyoak moved to send the proposed answer. Bill McDougald
seconded. MOTION CARRIED.

Dale reported the level is below the found leak, KEN'S LAKE
and recommended trying to make it through the irrigation
system, avoid pumping the wells, to get the lake as low as
possible by the end of the season and then let the water
stand for two or three days after the pipeline and tunnel is
shut off. We can go ahead and patch the upper leaks at any
time. Dale reported the loss this year had been 2,000 AF
opposed to 700 AF last year. The survey has been done, he
hasn't seen it yet, but he is concerned that this might be
the same leak we had fixed three years ago. Dale stated
Larry Anderson does not feel we can prove any liability by
the engineer, because of the language in the engineer's
report and the fact that it is 8 years old, there might be a
statute of limitations. Dale is in touch with Doug Bedke,
and he will take him to view the leak and get his recommen-
dations.

The financial statement was handed to those FINANCIAL
present. Dale reported that Marsha is preparing the amended STATEMENT
budget.

The meeting adjourned at 8:25 A. M.
