I am Alive: Prayer

For a Christian, praying is like air. It is our breath. It is our life with God. He is our best friend and king!

In order to keep a friendship alive, you need to talk to your friend, right? It is the same with God. He longs to hear from you. You are his sweet child. He is waiting.

Let's make sure our prayers are not just about us. Prayers can often sound like this: "Dear God, Give me this. Give me that. Amen." Ouch! God is not our servant. We are his servants. Learn to follow this prayer pattern. It will help you grow into a mighty, praying Christian.

IP-R-A-Y

"I am sorry." Start by telling God the sins you've been doing. Our honesty opens his ears.

Praise him! Tell him how amazing he is. Sing him a praise song. That makes him happy.

Rejoice! Thank him for prayers he answers. Give thanks for your food, water, family, and good life.

Ask him for help and for what you would like. He is your Father. He wants to bless and help you.

Yes. Listen for his voice. "Yes, God, I want to obey."

Each and every day, God hears you when you pray.



Story S-t-r-e-tch-ing

Show students where the story is in the Bible. Use the Bible references above the illustration.

Before you read:

Activate Prior Knowledge

- b) If you had to explain prayer to a little child, what would you say?
- c) For you, what is the hardest part about praying?

Let's Talk

Talk about ways we communicate today: calling, email, text, Facebook, Instagram, etc. How do you talk to your friends? Why do we spend so much time communicating with each other? Yes, to show that we care. God is the best friend you will ever have. The great news is that he WANTS to hear from you. How? Through prayer. What is prayer? Simply...talking to God. It's how you show God you care about him. God is your loving Father and he wants to hear your thoughts, feelings, needs, wants, and even your questions, fears, and doubts. Close your eyes while I say a silent prayer to God (say nothing). I didn't even speak out loud. I just thought a message to God, and it reached his ears faster than lightening! It is safe to say that prayer is the most amazing and powerful force we humans have. We can touch and move the heart of God! The Bible is God talking to us; prayer is us talking to God. It is how we form a relationship with him.

Recite together the key verse and write it on the <u>board</u>: "Pray in the Spirit always with all kinds of prayers and requests (Ephesians 6:18)." Make headings like this:

Go through the I-P-R-A-Y prayer pattern. Write some of those ideas under the above categories. What ways do you know to pray? You can pray with your eyes open or closed; kneeling, walking, laying down. Pray with your hands together or palms up. Some people like to cover their face with their hands so they can concentrate. You can pray out loud, whispers, with friends, alone, or silently. You can even sing a prayer. Pray outside, in a tree, in a quiet closet, or even in a car. Pray all day long, everywhere, and anywhere. Keep your friendship with God alive and warm.

Wishful Thinking or True Prayer?

Teach kids the difference between a real prayer and wishful thinking. Often, children will try to pray like this: "I hope that I can find my cat." But that is not really a prayer. How can they turn that into a real prayer? Teach them to pray directly: "Dear God, I am so sad that my cat is lost. Please let me find Muffin. Keep her warm and safe until you bring her home. Amen." To make this concept clear, get a fancy chair; pretend it is the throne of God. Label it "My Heavenly Father." You are a child of God and you have a want or need. Would you wishfully think a thought or would go directly to your father and humbly ask for what you want or need? Read Hebrews 4:16 and practice coming boldly to the throne of grace so that God can help us in our time of need.

Make Your Prayers Personal

Give each child a <u>card</u> that you bought at the store that has a pre-printed message or use the one below. (Photocopy it onto card stock. Create your own front cover. You can cut and paste the images and words for the front.) Now, next to the manufactured message, write a personalized note to the child telling her why you are grateful she is in your life. Have the kids open them. Ask: "What did you read first – the message that I wrote myself or the printed words that the card company wrote? Why?" Jesus tells us to not pray the same "pre-written" memorized prayers over and over again (Matthew 6:5-8). With those kinds of prayers, it's easy for the heart to drop out, and the lips to move without thinking or feeling. Like you, God wants our real feelings and personal prayers. Give each child a blank card or paper. Have them write a personal prayer to God.

I PRAY Mix and Match



Raise a Red Flag

In the old days, people only had letters to communicate. The mailman would raise a red flag on the side of the mailbox to let the family know a letter had arrived. Think of a mother whose son has gone off to war. A letter from her son would be the most treasured thing in her life. Think of that poor mom looking out the window every day, wondering, "Is my son alive? Does he remember me? Does he love me enough to make time to communicate with me?" Then one day, the red flag is raised. She runs out to the mailbox to find the precious letter from her son. She is happy beyond words. God is our loving Father. He is waiting, longing to hear from us. Talk to him in prayer all day long.

Make a mailbox using an <u>oatmeal container</u>. Wrap and <u>tape</u> it with <u>paper</u>. To make the flag, use an empty <u>toilet paper roll</u>. Wrap it with paper too. Tape a <u>red piece of paper</u> to it. Pierce a tiny hole on the inside of the oatmeal box and toilet paper roll. Connect them with a <u>brad</u> to raise and lower the red flag.

Have the kids each write a prayer to God on an <u>index card</u>. Show them the mailbox and recite this poem.

It's been awhile... Where is God's smile?


Send God a letter (put your prayers in)

One-Word Wonders

God listens to long or super short prayers, like the list below. Photocopy onto card stock one of these sheets per child. Cut the squares. Each player gets and keeps up to five words in their hand at all times. Look at the eight prayers. As soon as they can form one of the sentences (super short prayers) below, they set that prayer aside. At each turn, draw two cards. Keep both or discard one or two. Whoever runs out of cards first, wins. Now, how many mini prayers can you say without looking? Say them often and daily.
