I was disappointed to learn that Herb and the pretty pole would not be joining us on this trip. I was the last one to arrive but was greeted by Rich and our 3 new members. I was however just in time for a dropper loop lesson from Rich then it was off to bed. I awoke not long after 6 to fish for the elusive White Sea Bass. On our first stop we all managed to get our lines nice and wet I am assuming that was the purpose of that particular stop as no one caught anything (maybe some kelp). As we made our way along the island we stopped at a few more spot to fish for Calicos and the bottom for whatever would bite. The fishing was by no

Wow – what a trip! Limits on Ling Cod and some nice Reds to boot. Splitting the jackpot Ernie Branch made the trip even more rewarding. I was thrilled just to have a fish in contention let alone a winner. Even though my trip ended well it sure didn't start that way. I had the proper gear the trip - though at home and not with me.

Arriving Sunday the night before my GPS dropped me exactly where I wanted to be – in the center where the Pacific Dawn was docked. The last time I was out on the Pacific Dawn it was located at the other end of the harbor. With a 10:00pm departure I couldn't believe I was the first one there at 8:00pm and made a call to Rich Jenkins. He confirmed that I had the right date – and that everyone was there except me. Fortunately he is familiar with the area and figured out where I was and where I had to go. Everyone was indeed there and Mike Maurizio and Glenn Bummer came to

means wide open but with Steve as our captain we were soon on a couple decent bites. As the day went on everyone put fish in there bags had great conversations Johnny was helpful as always and good for a laughs in my case for a refresher on knot tying. While on the rail I saw several Calicos (mine was the biggest) about a dozen sheepshead both males and females Charlie had the largest fish on the boat with his if I remember correctly it was about 8 ½ lbs. Ron had a couple of Lings that were keepers. At the end of the trip everyone had some fish and a lot of laughs I must say it again what a great group of guys to fish with. This being my first Jackpot article I apologize for this being so brief but it could have read " I WON THE JACKPOT AND YOU DIDN'T "



the parking lot and gave me a hand with my gear. The Pacific Dawn showed up about an hour later and after clean up we all boarded. Whitney (the cook) had some appetizers out on the table and was helping people get situated.

We had 19 anglers and 6 crew onboard. From the club and friends were: Richard Jenkins, Sam Aanrosso, William Davies, Denice Florin, Kaili Chang, Glenn Bummer, Herb Mitchell, Christine and Joel Tuteaud, Xavier Lopez (with some killer salsa), Mike Maurizio, David Nies, Ernie Branch, Steve Ruffino, Ron Coleman, Paul Dawson, Karma Bell, Michail Margry, and myself.

Once underway captain Pat called everyone to the galley and gave a rundown on the day's fishing and his plans for the next. He said the weather should be perfect and advised how to rig our gear. After the meeting deckhands Opie, Mike, Moses and Tanner helped get us set up for the next day of fishing.

The ocean was calm and the ride very smooth all the way out. During the night I rolled over and something crunched. I figured it was the bag of potato chips in my back pack and didn't pay much mind. In the morning when the engines were cut I went out on deck and met Ron Coleman and Rich Jenkins near the bait tank. I made the comment that it was both foggy and hazy. They both agreed that it was foggy but not hazy. It was then I noticed the missing left lens in my glasses - explaining the crunch. Inquiring around no one had an eyeglass fixit kit (though Christine assured me she would have one the next time). I always bring a spare pair of glasses - but not on this trip. I did have prescription sunglasses and though worthless below decks were fine outside and in the galley.

At dawn nothing was biting and we went close to the island to get sand dabs. I happen to like sand dabs (to eat) and thought we were getting some eating fish. I was surprised when I saw the deckhands throwing the sand dabs into the community tank. I later realized we were making bait to go for ling cod.

After a short ride somewhere out further from the island captain Pat told us all to get ready to drop. I had brought 3 rigs with 15, 25, and 40 pound test. He advised using spectra with a short top shot of mono as we were going to be fishing in about 350 feet of water. I had deckhand Mike strip off the 200 or so feet of mono from my 'heavy 40 lb' reel leaving only about 10 feet of mono from the rest spectra. He rigged me up using my only 16 oz weight. On the first drop I used every bit of line (down to the spool) to get to the bottom. I hooked up and when I saw others bringing up big ling cod got really excited. Unfortunately my hit was a red - nice size - but still not a ling. Worse my only 16 oz weight was gone. I re-rigged with a 9 oz sinker but never was able to hit the bottom again with that setup. We were close to 30 lings on the boat (all I had was the one red) when I finally gave up on my gear. Noticing I was having problems deckhand Mike set me up with a boat rig. Using a borrowed 12 oz sinker from Ron Coleman (which I subsequently lost also) I was at least able to get to the bottom and participate in the bite. Captain Pat made repeat passes over the 'spot' and each time there were multiple hook ups. Somewhere around 40 lings he said we were going to do one last drop as the boat was close to limit. On cue I dropped with the others and when I got to the bottom felt a huge tug (spectra is really nice about that) and thought I was snagged. Calling a deckhand over he realized I was gaining line and said it was a fish. I believe it was the



last fish on the boat and a real toad – for sure a contender.

At weigh in Ernie and I put our fish on the balance and it was too close for the deckhand to call. Captain Pat gave us a couple choices and Ernie and I agreed the best option was to split. We later weighed the fish and both came in at over 17.5 lbs. After the jackpot had been decided Mike Maurizio weighed his heaviest and found it was 18 lbs (on his digital scale of course). Though Mike wasn't looking to change the jackpot decision he just had to know. We put his fish and Ernie's on the balance – and Ernie's was heavier. Sorry Mike – no story to tell on this one.

Rich Jenkins presented me the jackpot hat (Ernie has his special fishing hat) and informed me that I had to write this article. I tried to bribe Christine Tuteaud to write it but couldn't get anywhere with her. She was kind enough to give me the names of all onboard (including the crew) and some of her notes from the trip. Rich Jenkins also provided names which helped with spelling. I wish I'd taken some notes myself about my fellow anglers experiences but this caught me off guard. Having never won a jackpot with this group I had no expectations. Anyway if I've stated events incorrectly or left off any worth mentioning it was not intentional.
