#### "MATJE'S APACHES" RAID **FARM FOR ANNUAL SKI TRIP**

February 5 and 6, 2011: Mark the dates on your calendar and plan to ioin Troop 78 for the annual Matie farm ski/board campout. We will ski at Elk Mountain on Saturday, February 5, and camp out at Mr. Matje's farm that night. Pick up your handout on the trip at the January 7th Troop meeting.

Beginner ski package: \$39 (lift,

lesson, rental)

Beginner board package: \$67 (lift,

lesson, rental)

**Ski rental:** \$30 – 13 and over; \$27 –

under 12

**Board rental:** \$33 – all ages **Helmet rental:** \$7 – all ages

ALL Troop 78 skiers and boarders MUST wear a helmet in accordance with BSA and Troop 78 rules – NO EXCEPTIONS.

# Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) for Matje Farm/Elk Mountain trip:

#### I am a first-time skier. Should I rent skis and buy a lift ticket, or should I get the beginner package?

A: Get the beginner package. The lesson will be invaluable. Elk is a challenging mountain. Plus, the group rate for the beginner's package will save money.

# I get "helmet head" when I snowboard, and I don't look cool. Is it okay if I just wear a hat and skip the helmet?

A: NO! Helmets are mandatory for skiers and boarders. Troop 78 has followed this rule for a number of years, and now the BSA has adopted the requirement. Bring a comb – but you must wear a helmet.

#### I ski the "black diamonds" at Bear Creek. Can I ski the "blacks" at Elk?

A: The rating system rates the mountain's relative difficulty and not the overall difficulty of a mountain. Elk's black diamonds are very challenging. The blue squares and green circles at Elk provide great terrain – long runs with plenty of vertical drop. As is the rule at every ski resort, "Ski and board within your ability level." And stay in control!

# If my parents, sister and kid brother drive up to Elk, can they get the group rate, too?

A: Yes, accompanying family can get the Willistown Troop 78 group rate. Family members must remit payment with the Scout's payment for the trip.

I've never skied. Can I wear jeans? Do I need to wear a ski jacket? A: Borrow ski pants or a ski bib, and wear an appropriate jacket. It's important to dress for the weather. The packing list for the trip will be included in the handout.



#### HEADING TO DISNEY WORLD WITH TROOP 78? RESERVE YOUR SPOT FOR SPRING BREAK – APRIL 15-23

With a five-day Park-Hopper ticket, you can visit any of the four theme parks (Magic Kingdom, Disney's Hollywood Studios, Animal Kingdom, and Epcot), and you can use your pass for up to five visits to DisneyQuest and the water parks (Typhoon Lagoon, Blizzard Beach), or just swim and hang out at the Fort Wilderness campground at any time.

The Troop committee has determined as eligible those Scouts who -

- 1) are registered and active in the Troop (50% minimum participation),
- attended or worked at summer camp at least one week in 2010,
- 3) are or will be First Class rank by April 5th, and
- 4) are responsible enough to visit the theme parks on their own with a small group of other Scouts as determined by their parents and the Scoutmaster.

The total cost including bus transportation, food, camping fees, a five-day Park-Hopper Disney pass, is expected to be only \$475.00. Money from your Scout camping account may be used for this trip. A \$200 deposit is due by **January 28th**. Note: Although all meals are provided at the campsite, most Scouts bring \$100 to \$150 spending money for food (lunch in the parks), beverages, souvenirs, etc.

Reserve your spot now by sending your deposit of \$200 per person via check payable to Willistown Troop 78, B.S.A. to Miles Stevens,

Once you reserve a spot you will receive further instructions regarding departure times, what to pack, spending money, bus preparation etc. We must have at least 20 Scouts and adults to camp at Disney. If we do not have 16 Scouts, we will have to cancel; so talk it up!

## WHAT IS A MERIT BADGE COUNSELOR?

The Troop would like to increase the opportunities each Scout has to earn merit badges by increasing the number of merit badge counselors. We will be holding a short training course on Saturday, January 22, in the afternoon. (Yes, that date should sound familiar. It's Winter Camp; you'll be there already at Browning Lodge, Camp Horseshoe.)

What is a merit badge counselor, you ask? Well, a merit badge counselor is a key player in the Bov Scout advancement program. Whatever your area of expertise or interestwhether it is a special craft or hobby (basketry, leatherwork, coin collecting), a profession (veterinary medicine, aviation, engineering), or perhaps a life skill (cooking, personal management, communications)—as a merit badge counselor, you can play a vital role in stirring a young man's curiosity about that particular topic. By serving as a merit badge counselor, you offer your time, knowledge, and other resources so that Scouts can explore a topic of interest.

As a merit badge counselor, your mission is to join fun with learning. You are both a teacher and mentor to the Scout as he works on a merit badge and learns by doing. By presenting opportunities for growth via engaging activities like designing a Web page (Computers), performing an ollie and a wheelie (Snow Sports), or fabricating rope (Pioneering), you can pique a young man's interest in the merit badge subject. Just think:

Your hands-on involvement could inspire a Scout to develop a lifelong hobby, pursue a particular career, or become an independent, self-supporting adult.

Once you have the training, you can register to be a counselor for any merit badge that you wish. For a full listing of merit badges, please refer to the listing on http://meritbadge.org/.

There are more than 100 merit badges a Scout can earn. The Troop has a counselor for all of the Eagle required merit badges but not all badges a Scout needs for Eagle are required. Troop 78 would also like to have more than one counselor for each badge, so that the responsibility is shared.

#### **ADULT TRAINING CORNER**

In addition to the online trainings that we hope you all are finding time to complete, there are some other opportunities.

There are how-to guides and course information located on the training section of the Troop website (willistown78.org), if you have questions about creating an online account or what courses are required for your leadership position.

The only known upcoming training course is the Wilderness and Remote First Aid course, Saturday & Sunday, January 15 & 16, held at the Horseshoe Scout Reservation (not overnight). Sign up on www.cccbsa.org; look for training.

The Wilderness and Remote First Aid course gives you the skills you need to respond to an emergency when help may be delayed an hour or more. The course is based on the Boy Scouts of America Wilderness First Aid Curriculum and Doctrine Guidelines and meets the requirements of BSA's High Adventure bases (Philmont, Northern Tier and Sea Base). This course includes classroom instruction and demonstration. hands-on skills practice, and real-life scenarios.
