Reminder that the Show is the FINANCIAL ENGINE for the club. Special acknowledgements to Wayne, Randy, Larry and Jane for all their hard work as well as those who helped with the setup and take down of the show.

It is unfair for so much of the responsibilities and duties for this and the clubs other activities and events to fall to Larry. We are looking for at least a couple of members to mentor under Larry to learn the ropes and provide assistance to Larry. Larry has a binder that needs to be updated – tasks, duties, responsibilities, timelines, contacts, etc.

Profit from this years show was approximately \$9,000 – 150 geodes cracked

Attendance was down this year by approximately 400 to 1200

Golf cart was very appreciated. Tailgate on Sunday needs more participants, remember that other than the silent auctions, this is the only other option for those wishing to sell items like jewelry, equipment, materials, etc. during the show that does not compete with the venders at the show.

Several dealers complained they don't make enough, so we are considering some options for future shows that may benefit both sides. The suggestions on this subject will be brought up at a future meeting and options will be put to a vote of the entire membership at a future meeting. Some of the details are still being worked through that need to be addressed before presenting to the membership. Will keep you posted to when, once we get the details worked out. Any final decisions will need to be approved via a vote.

Vibratory Tumbling Obsidian & Fire Agate

On June 8th, our club president, Dave Westland came to Mickee Madden's workshop to demonstrate how he tumbles obsidian and fire agate in a vibratory tumbler. His machine is a Raytech Tumble-Vibe 5.

1) 220 grit. 2 tsp. Run for 4-6 hours.

- * Make sure bottom nut is on tightly. The bowl should not rotate.
- * Fill bowl 1/4 with water
- * Load ceramic medium (small and large) into the bowl until bowl is about half full.
- * Add about 12 to 15 obsidian cabochons (and some fire agate with the fire sections removed from the matrix)
- * Start machine. If the loaded material is rolling over smoothly, add grit. Check halfway through a run. If wave motion is slow, add a little more water. When finished, rinse stones, media and bowl thoroughly.
- * Use Vaseline along the rim of the bowl to prevent leakage. Put on cover and secure the nut snuggly. (scratches should be gone and a "matte" surface)
- **2) 400 grit: 2 teaspoons. Run for 4-6 hours.** Follow previous instructions. Wash material, bowl and cover very well. (smooth satin-matte surface)
- 3) Tripoli: 2 teaspoons. Follow first round instructions but tumble for 2 days. Dave does not run his machine overnight, but runs it 12 hours one day, then turns it off and leaves everything in the bowl. The second day, add another teaspoon of Tripoli to the mix and a little more water if needed. Run for 12 hours. Wash materials, bowl and lid thoroughly for last round. (very smooth surface)
- **4) Tin Oxide: 2 teaspoons:** Follow round 3 instructions. 12 hours over 2 days.
- **5)** If you want a very high shine, run with a pinch of Ivory Snow soap for 4-8 hours after the Tin Oxide.

Dave has been vibratory tumbling for so long that he doesn't measure. I used the amounts shown on the Raytech Tumble-Vibe chart.

Thank you, Dave, for a fun and informative demonstration! And thank you for the written notes to share with the club!

Chrysocolla by James

Chrysocolla is a turquoise or sky-blue stone that is found in Utah and Arizona but also found in many other parts of the world such as the Democratic Republic of Congo and Chile. Chrysocolla is used for jewelry and is known to balance the digestive system. Chrysocolla is also a hydrated copper silicate.

Heulandite by Bryson

Heulandite is a naturally occurring zeolite mineral belonging to the Heulandite subgroup within the zeolite group. It's characterized by its platy habit, where crystals tend to form flat, sheet-like shapes. Heulandite is often found in various colors, including brown, pink, white, orange, and marshy green. Heulandite typically forms in low temperature environments.
