Pam Blankenship, Nutrition Co-Coordinator

"I have served in healthcare settings for more than 30 years," says Pam, "because I want to make a difference in the lives of seniors."

Serving as a dietary aide in a skilled nursing facility over summer break, at age 16, kicked off her life-long commitment to nurturing and proving nutrition to some of the most vulnerable among us.

Her trajectory took her from dietary aide to cook to kitchen manager over a 30+ year career. Most recently, during the Covid pandemic, she served a skilled nursing facility in Fayette county, near her home.

"I realized I needed to make a change, to have different challenges, and Holly happened to call at the right moment! I began with Pickaway Senior Center in November 2021."

When you meet Pam, you can tell she loves to cook and she's a real people person. Her desire to make a difference is readily evident as well. Her favorite part of the day is after the more than 375 home delivered meals are prepared, packaged, and out the door, and the congregate meal is prepared and served, she has the time to sit down with our guests and share the meal she's prepared.

"I love it here at the Center. I enjoy visiting with our lunch guests each day and working with staff to ensure our senior neighbors and friends are fed and cared for."

All told, Pam prepares at least 400 meals, each day, Monday-Friday, for the YOUR Senior Center!

USPS MAIL SNAGS got mail?

New postal service software and/ or equipment requires different address details. If you expected your newsletter in the mail, but had to pick it up, please let us know! Last month, more than 70 mail pieces were returned to us with "incorrect address" or "no mail receptacle". The issues were typically related to an incorrect apartment or lot number, an abbreviation for "highway" or the directional indicator (N, S, E, W) being spelled out. Some of these "errors" left your Administrative staff and volunteers scratching their heads. It took the full team, working for a little over a week, to resolve all the issues, but we accomplished the task!

Today, tomorrow and for a lifetime.


Who We Serve

- People in our area who are eligible to receive our aid are missing, on average, 52 days of eating a year.
- We serve 20 counties covering nearly 10,000 square miles.
- Our goal is to close the 144 million-meal gap in our region.

We provide more than 170,000 meals each day for hungry people in central and eastern Ohio. Our network of 680 member agencies directly distribute the vast majority of the nutritious food the Mid-Ohio Foodbank handles each year.

HEAT-RELATED CHALLENGES FOR OLDER ADULTS (Spotlight: Ohio Department of Aging)

Temperatures in the 90s with a heat index of 100F or higher are possible in August. The Ohio Department of Aging reminds us extreme heat should be treated with the same care and preparation as summer storms.

"As we age, we sometimes find that our bodies can't handle extreme conditions as well as when we were younger," said Ursel J McElroy, director of the department. "Know your limitations and take precautions to help your body stay cool. Check on older loved ones and neighbors regularly, since they are at increased risk for heat-related illness and complications."

To stay cool during extremely hot days, the department recommends:

- Drinking plenty of cool, non-alcoholic beverages (avoiding extremely cold liquids and beverages with high levels of sugar or caffeine);
- Wearing loose-fitting, lightweight clothing and resting frequently;
- Planning outdoor activities for cooler parts of the day, such as early morning or late evening;
- Taking cool baths or showers; and
- Seeking an air-conditioned environment, such as a store, restaurant, public library, or a family member's
 or neighbor's home, if the indoor temperature in your home is higher than is comfortable.

All Ohioans are encouraged to check in on older loved ones and neighbors before, during, and after severe weather, including very hot days. Checking in helps them feel connected and lets them know you care. It also gives you an opportunity to ensure they are safe and healthy and have the resources to stay that way.

- Is the indoor temperature comfortable? Is there safe means to keep it that way if it stays hot outside?
- Do they need medical attention? Do they appear alert and aware? Have they fallen? Are they staying cool enough? Are they taking their medications as prescribed?
