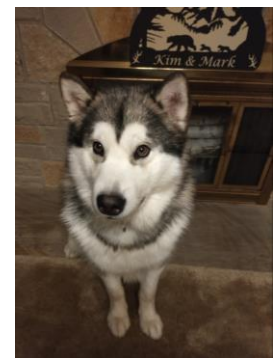

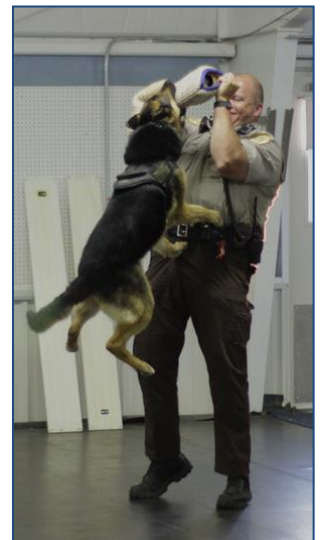

Dog Treat Recipes

Peanut Butter & Applesauce Cookies for Dogs

Ingredients

- 3 c whole wheat flour
- 2 c quick-cook oats
- 1 c peanut butter (smooth or chunky, your choice!)
- 1 c unsweetened organic applesauce
- 1 t baking powder
- 1/4-1/2 cup olive oil or coconut oil, optional



Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees and cover 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.
- In a mixing bowl, combine all ingredients well.
- Knead dough on a lightly floured surface. If the dough is too loose and crumbly, you can add a 1/4-1/2 cup olive oil or coconut oil at this point.
- Use a rolling pin to roll the dough to about 1/4 inch thick and then cut into shapes with cookie cutters. If you don't want to use cookie cutters, simply make small dough balls.
- Place cookies on baking sheet, approximately 1/2 inch apart.
- Bake in preheated oven for approximately 25 minutes or until lightly browned.
- Let cool and then serve.

Notes

- Store uneaten cookies in an airtight container in the fridge for up to one week.

Pumpkin Banana Cheddar Balls

Ingredients

- 2 cups white rice flour (Bob's Red Mill or similar)
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp ginger
- 1/4 tsp cloves
- 1/2 cup canned pumpkin (NOT pumpkin pie mix)
- 1/2 medium extra ripe banana
- 2 tbsp honey
- 2 tbsp coconut oil
- 1/2 cup water
- 1 egg
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 pieces of dog friendly jerky (optional)

Instructions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit
2. Mix together dry ingredients in a medium bowl (white rice flour, baking powder, cinnamon, ginger, cloves)
3. Whisk together wet ingredients in another bowl (pumpkin, banana, honey, coconut oil, water, and egg)
4. Add wet ingredients to dry ingredients and mix
5. The mixture should be thick and not too sticky. If it is still too sticky, mix in some extra white rice flour.
6. Fold the cheddar cheese into the mixture
7. Roll mixture into 1/2 inch to 1 inch balls and place on a nonstick baking sheet
8. Bake for 20 - 25 minutes depending on size
9. Optional: Add a jerky stem to the top of each cookie, so that it will look like a little pumpkin


Any dog friendly jerky will work for the pumpkin stem. These treats will be crunchy on the outside and soft on the inside. Because they will still have some moisture, they will probably only keep for about a week. Be sure to keep them in a sealed container for a longer shelf life.

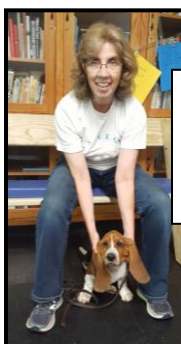
