

42. Further Description of Important Features (Continue on reverse if necessary) This hip-roofed house is built on a square plan and has a brick chimney located at the apex of the gables. The street facade features a secondary cross gable (detailed with cornice returns) over the entranceway which is sheltered by a pedimented gable resting on turned columns. 3. History and Significance * The house was owned by the Frederick Baumler family for many years, and oral tradition sites him as builder c1902. At this time Fred had married his wife, Theresa, and left his family home on Ward Rd. (ERI-1754). This date would be further supported by the fact that the 1896 map of Kelleys Island shows the land undeveloped, and that of 1909 lists F. Baumler as the		26. 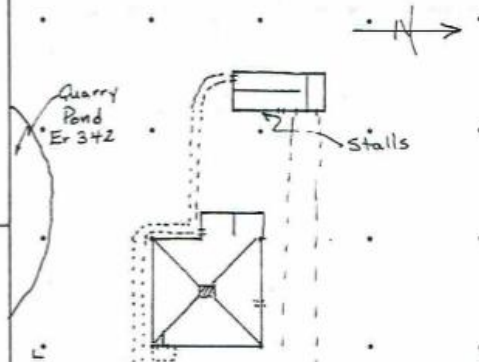

owner of record. Born on the island in 1872, Fred was the son of Swiss immigrants John and Mary Baumlner. Though living on his father's farm and undoubtedly helping there as did his brother, Henry, Fred's trade was blacksmithing and was so listed in the 1900 Census. After moving to this house he is reported to have built a smithy in the rear of his home, and also to have used the smithy across the road at Ed Bauman's (ERI-1580). He also worked for the KIL&T Co. in their West Quarry Shop (ERI-1539) as welder and blacksmith. In the 1950's fisherman, Jay Norris and his wife, May Riedy Norris, lived here. It has since been used as summer residence. In the 1920's "Butch" Blatt and his wife Olive Lincoln lived here.
