Harmonica Musings and Such:

I've got a couple of **New Year Resolutions** that I'd like to work on. **One-** I'm going to try to go out and play in more "jam" situations. I seldom play with actual humans but there are some low key/low pressure groups that can be found. Playing with others forces me to listen to the direction and timing of the music. Along with this I'll look up familiar you tube songs and try to incorporate my playing appropriate-ly. "Appropriately" mostly means, don't play to much or too loud (both of which I tend to do). Sometimes just quiet background chords are all that's needed.

The second very fun thing on my list for improvement is exploring different rhythm ideas by listening to different artists playing the same song. Once I've figured out how to play the standard way for a given melody, I ask my phone to show me different jazz versions of that song on you tube. You can find very simple jazz enhancements (that are easily reproduced) and sometimes advanced crazy stuff. Look up even simple songs like "Mary Had a Little Lamb" or "Oh Susannah" jazz versions on you tube and try to get some new ideas.
