Civic Report

Traffic Action Plan

The signage at Ginnever /19th will be changed from "No Buses/Trucks" to a weight limit sign. This is to conform to enforcement policies. Currently, police can only warn buses turning left. With the weight limit sign, they can cite offenders.

Other TAP plans: The City will employ an additional staff member which should speed up the process to roll out the TAP. With the end of June being the end of the fiscal year, they plan to push some of the smaller items on the list before then. They also plan to bundle some of the intersection and red curbing changes across San Mateo and get a single contractor to complete the tasks early July. This will include the left turn lane into Fiesta Gardens School. Signage has gone up at the 19th / Ginnever intersection warning not to block the intersections. SMPD has begun enforcement - please be sure to thank them when you see them.

Sewage Tank

The public works department (PWD) presented the final two options (the Events Center and the Corporate Yard) to the Public Works Commission (PWC) on June 14th. The preferred site was the Events Center, which the PWC endorsed (3 for, 1 abstain, 1 absent) but wanted more emphasis on mitigation of noise and pollution. The proposed site is in the RV park by Saratoga- <u>this will</u> <u>directly affect our residents living on Kent St</u>. The PWD will take the recommendations to the City Council for approval on July 19th. I encourage all residents to attend to hear what is being proposed and voice your concerns.

Peninsula Clean Energy Plan

Peninsula Clean Energy, or PCE, is San Mateo County's official electricity provider. PCE is a public, locallycontrolled community choice energy program that provides all electric customers in San Mateo County the choice of having electricity supplied from clean, renewable sources at competitive rates. PCE's ECOplus option is 50% renewable and 75% greenhouse gas emissions free, and PCE's ECO100 option is 100% renewable and 100% greenhouse gas emissions free. (PGE is currently 30% renewable) PCE currently serves approximately 80,000 accounts, and will serve approximately 300,000 accounts by May 2017 when its enrollment process is complete._ Everyone has been automatically enrolled in the ECO50 plan as of this time. Residents and businesses will receive four notices in the mail with details about their new choices. You can choose to opt in to the ECO100 plan by going to the PCE website

The pool is now open daily, 12:00 noon until 8:00 p.m. On days that are cool or even rainy we may close early. At 6:00 p.m. we evaluate the activity at the pool and if no one is there we will close early. If you happen to want to swim on one of these cold nights, we will stay open for you. Just a few reminders when visiting the pool:

- Wear your wristbands
- Pay for your guests. It's just \$2.00 per guest up to a total of 5 guests per residence.
- Toddlers and infants MUST be in a swim diaper and even doubled up. We have had a few incidents that have caused the pool to be closed for 24 hours.

On to wristbands. We are in the process of building a data base so we know how many wristbands need to be delivered to each house. I have received 100's of emails stating, "I didn't get mine," "I didn't get the right amount" or "I want more just because." If you didn't get any wristbands that is because you have not paid your Association dues and there are a lot of you who have not. Paying your dues is not an option. There was no secret when buying your home in Fiesta Gardens that you were buying into an Association and responsible for paying HOA dues. If you are new to the neighborhood, we would have no way of knowing how many people are in your house so we just deliver 2 wristbands and are happy to deliver the amount you need. Remember, there were over 60 homes sold last year in our neighborhood so you may be one of those we are updating. Those of you who ask for more bands than the amount of people who reside in your residence, *Shame on you!* Wristbands are for residents ONLY! Any misuse of wristbands will cause you to be banned from having pool privileges. Our neighborhood is not that big we have a pretty good idea who and how many live where.

FGHA BOARD MEETING – May 3, 2017

Approved Minutes, Respectfully Submitted, Karen Debono, Secretary

The Board Meeting, which was held at Fiesta Gardens Pool Cabana, was called to order at 7:14pm. Board Members in attendance were: Joe D'Agostino-President, Roland Bardony-Parks, Pascale Stemmle & Carmen Quaresma-Social Directors, Mike Russell-Pool Maintenance, and Steve Muller-Vice President. Steve Stanovcak-Pool Operations, and Rich Neve – Civic, were absent.

April Minutes: On a motion duly made and seconded and approved by all board members present, the minutes with approved changes of the April 4, 2017 meeting were approved.

Financial - Christina Forrest

- o Chrissy explained that the March financial was not the one going in to the Fiesta Gardens Bee because it wasn't reflective of the new budget (She doesn't have it from Joe D'Agostino yet).
- o Joe will talk to attorney Tom Fier about the retainer.
- o Tom Fier sent documents to the owners that claim they are not part of the association.
- o She is still working on insurance bids.
- o The association has approximately 300k in reserves.

President - Joe D'Agostino

- o Budget was approved at last month's board meeting. It has not been sent out to owners yet.
- o Joe D'Agostino is to complete a "Notice of Acceptance" required the city. Notice needs to go out to owners and they are allowed a period of time to respond.
- o Friday, May 5th Joe D'Agostino will go to the Planning Department to inquire more about the "Notice of Acceptance."
- o Governing Documents: The CC&Rs were not passed. Association will go to court and ask judge to change percentage needed by owners to pass. Currently waiting for date of court hearing. Membership can come to the hearing. This is done when Board of Directors has been unable to get enough owners to vote.
- o Bylaws were passed.

Open Forum:

- o A new Fiesta Gardens owner was introduced and welcomed to the meeting.
- o Residents in attendance discussed neighborhood traffic issues and possible solutions.
- o A resident suggested that the BOD offer some type of recognition to homeowners that have made improve-

ments to their yards. Possibly put an announcement in the Bee.

Vice President - Steve Muller: had nothing to report.

Civic - Rich Neve: A report was given on behalf of Rich as he was not in attendance.

- o City has signed a contract with the Event Center to place sewage tank on their property.
- o Sewage Rates will be increasing.
- o Discussed traffic issues and possible solutions it was suggested that the board put together a traffic solution recommendation and present it to the city.

Social - Pascale Stemmle:

o Summer Pool Party: Has been scheduled for Saturday, July 8, 2017.

Parks - Roland Bardony:

- o Trees were treated for aphids.
- o Children's Park sandbox has been filled with sand.
- o Park: Roland will fill holes that were created by graffiti removal truck and reseeded the area.

Pool Maintenance - Mike Russell:

- o Reported that the pool is currently non-functional. They should have it working properly and ready for use by Saturday, May 13, 2017.
- o Pool Opening is scheduled for May 13th, weekends only, 12noon to 8pm

- o Wrist bands have been ordered.
- o Beginning Tuesday, June 13th, the pool will be open 7 days a week 12noon to 8pm.

o Joe D'Agostino-President reported that he is in contact with the architect that drew up the new clubhouse plans. Drawings are complete.
