# MINUTES OF REGULAR SESSION OF COUNCIL WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 9, 2019

Regular session of Borough Council convened at 7:30 pm. Present were Councilors Janice Matyasovsky, Tim Sloss, Mike Zrenchak, Mike Matlos, Melissa Morgan, and Chris Ponchak; Mayor Larry Sikorski; Solicitor Matt Racunas; and Engineer Don Glenn.

## **PUBLIC COMMENTS.**

Marcy Cendroski, 3246 Jeffrey Drive, informed us that she is now reporting the minutes for Liberty Borough Council Meetings for an online newspaper. She said for everyone to let her know whether they do or do not want their name in the article for the online paper. Mrs. Cendroski asked about the house at the end of Jeffrey Drive (3214). She wanted to know if it was sold or if the borough still owned it. Both, Mr. Ponchak and Mr. Racunas agreed that the house was sold. Mr. Racunas explained that in fact the house has been sold but that he was not sure if the closing was happening yet because there is another attorney handling that transaction. He said that he tries to get an update and he anticipates that the closing took place but that he hasn't heard much about the house. Mrs. Cendroski said that she still sees the Borough employees cutting the grass. Mr. Racunas explained that even if we don't own the property, the public works might still have to maintain the property and then lien it. Mrs. Cendroski said that the neighbors and she would like the weeds to overgrow on the house roof and hide it so no one has to look at it.

Eileen Wall, 3403 Orchard Drive, said she was confused about the election. She said she was told by the county that the Democratic and Republican parties would pick somebody to run to fill that extra seat but that other people told her the seat would be filled by the write ins. Mrs. Wall was hoping that someone could clarify. Mrs. Morgan explained that this is a write in campaign. Mr. Ponchak agreed that it is going to be a write in campaign. Mrs. Wall was worried about the people putting in fake names for election and the fake name winning. Mr. Racunas explained that there is a time limit where you have to be sworn in after you win and if not then basically Council would appoint someone to fill that position and that seat will be voted on in the next election.

Dan McClelland, 3300 Oakland Drive, asked if he could get an update about why the yellow lines have not been painted from the original ordinance. Mr. Ponchak said that he has just completed a map using Google Earth, whereas he is outlining everything from the old ordinance and the new ordinance that needs to be done and he will be submitting it to the Public Works soon. Mr. McClelland wanted to know what the hurry was to get the new yellow lines painted before the ordinance was even approved. Mr. Racunas explained that there is something called the Pending Ordinance Doctrine. As long as that ordinance is in place and being properly approved, it is still valid. It was still enforceable, even if it was not publically adopted at that point. Mr. McClelland wanted to know why Liberty Borough was dragging their feet painting the yellow lines according to the old ordinance, but that they were in a rush to paint the yellow lines for the new

Cathy Beadling, 2805 A Street, asked how many open seats are in this upcoming election. Mr. Ponchak told her that there are four open seats. Ms. Beadling wanted to know how we were going to know who to vote for if Jennifer McClelland is the only write in. Mr. Racunas explained to Ms. Beadling that there are three people on the ticket for four seats. Those three people, assuming they don't get beat by other write ins, will most likely be in the winning. The other seat will go to whoever gets the most write ins. Ms. Beadling asked when the flu shots are. Mrs. Morgan told her that it is October 12, 2019, 9:00 am – 11:00 am. Ms. Beadling wanted to know if it was going to be a regular flu shot. Mr. Ponchak informed her that it was most likely will be.

Mayor Sikorski expressed his concern with the EMS being so far away that it is necessary for Liberty Borough Police to be in the Borough and available. He said it is very important because in a short time a person could have a lot of problems before the ambulance could get here. Mayor Sikorski said the police are going to have to pick up the slack. He is unsure how we can make this happen, but he wants the police to be there within at least a couple of minutes. He said that getting to a call in 11,12,13 minutes is just uncalled for and is going to need to be faster. Mayor Sikorski will be looking into how he can make this more time efficient.

## SOLICITOR RACUNAS'S REPORT.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Ordinance 2019-04, providing for three additional handicap parking spots. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mr. Ponchak, and passed unanimously.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Ordinance 2019-05, for Pennsylvania Municipal Retirement System, adoption agreement. It has been properly advertised. The motion was made by Mr. Matlos, seconded by Mrs. Morgan, and passed unanimously.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Resolution 2019-04 for a CDBG grant for B Street Storm Sewer in the amount of \$41,470.00. The motion was made by Mrs. Morgan, seconded by Mr. Matlos, and passed unanimously.

Mr. Racunas called for a motion to adopt Resolution 2019-05 for a CDBG grant for Glenn Avenue Embankment Restoration in the amount of \$30,992.00. The motion was made by Mr. Ponchak, seconded by Mrs. Morgan, and passed unanimously.
