Convention Update

After three years of conducting the business of the Episcopal Diocese of Chicago via online Zoom meetings, we were able to once again, discuss and argue the resolutions, vote for the many diocesan positions, attend workshops and listen to Bishop Jake Owensby (Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Western Louisiana) and Bishop Paula Clark (Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of Chicago) all in person at the Western Hotel in Lombard on November 17th and 18th. Annunciation of our Lady Church was represented by seven members of the Parish; the three delegates, John Anderson, Debbie Rakestraw and myself and four clergy; Pastor Jenni, Deacon Anne, Rev. Jane and Deacon Linda.

There was a true sense of community and camaraderie in the Great Ballroom that we used to meet, discern, vote, pray, and worship during the two days of the convention. We listened to Bishop Paula, in her sermon at the Friday afternoon Eucharist, talk about the parable of the Vine Grower and how we are to abide in God's love and to abide in Jesus. She discussed how the pruning the vine will make it more fruitful and that the best days

are yet to come.

Bishop Owensby, in his keynote address to the convention, discussed the concepts of hope, wishful thinking and religious optimism. He referred to St Paul's discussion of faith, hope and love and that they are the foundations of Christian life. He also suggested that the prospect of getting what we want is what keeps us going in this world. Bishop Owensby asked everyone at each table in the convention hall to discuss how we felt about hope and wishful thinking. We had a very engaging and thought provoking discussion at our table. Actions for Peace and Justice

What does the LORD require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6:8

In the selection from St. Paul's First Letter to the Thessalonians that we heard, Saint Paul tells us to stay awake and to put on the breastplate of faith and love. One way to stay awake is to be aware of how the people of the Episcopal Church act for Justice and Peace, and perhaps take a recommended action. Two excellent resources are the Episcopal Peace Fellowship and the Office of Government Relations of the Episcopal Church.

Wednesday and Sunday Study

The Wednesday class on the Acts of the Apostles is now complete as will be the Sunday class this week.

We finished learning about the Epistles written by Paul then heard about what happened to each of the Apostles after



Acts, if anything is known. Some were beheaded, a more "humane" death than crucifixion or being thrown to the wild beasts. Some were crucified and some lived to a ripe old age. And the rest, we don't know what happened. The information about what happened to each of "the boys" came from a book entitled After Acts by Bryan Litfin. At the end of the book he says,

"So then, what happened to the apostles after Acts? The answer is simple. They died and went on to their reward - but they also left behind their successors, the men and women who received the torch of the Christian faith and passed it to the next generation.

"This process continued through the centuries. Now the torch has come down to us. What will we do with it? Wisdom would suggest that we learn from our forebears how to lift high the sacred flame. It has been well kept by those who have finished the race and are watching us compete. May we too be marked by courage and perseverance as we run the race set before us...because the One who is waiting for us at the end is entirely worth it." What a wonderful way to end a class!!!

Due to the possible timing of our next class and Lent, we are having discussions on what we should do next and when we should do it. As soon as we figure out what we all want to do, we will let you know. We will also let you know what we will be doing as our four week Lenten study on Wednesday nights as well.


