Ray bravely confronted adversity that most of us can, thankfully, only imagine. Ray refused to allow himself to be defined by ALS and lived every single day to the absolute fullest. I remain inspired by his anything-is-possible attitude and he was my inspiration to register for the inaugural Ironman Chattanooga, I will race in his honor.

On September 28, 2014 I will give my best in hopes of completing the 2.4 mile swim, 112 mile bike and 26.2 mile run that comprise an ironman triathlon and I will do so in honor of Ray DePauw and the thousands of individuals battling ALS across the country and across the world. I am incredibly blessed that this athletic event is the most difficult physical challenge I have faced.

In this challenge I have experienced incredible love and support from an entire community of friends and family and it is this community that I turn to now in order to raise funds to support those battling ALS. One of the things Ray was known for was his compassion for others in this battle and reaching out to them to lend his support in any way he could.
