

Luke 6:17, 20-26

Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

6th Sunday Ordinary Time

Year C Luke 6:17, 20-26

Poverty, Hunger, Grief and Insult! Beatitudes? Yes, Jesus says, "Rejoice and be glad, as your reward will be great in heaven!" Yet, it is understandable to question just exactly how such deprivations can be blessings! I can think of two ways to see these conditions as blessings. First, we can refer to OT passages such as "The Lord hears the cry of the poor" (Psalm 34:7), "The Lord satisfies the thirsty, and fills the hungry with good things" (Psalm 107:9), "At dusk comes weeping, but at dawn {the Lord} brings rejoicing" (Psalm 30:6) and "The stone the builders rejected, has become the cornerstone" (Psalm 118:22). (Not a surprise, that Jesus quotes the Psalms more than any other Old Testament book!) But secondly, we can also find exact scriptural correlates for each of these four beatitudes, where Jesus embodies these Beatitudes through His own actions. **Poverty** – "The Son of Man has nowhere to lay his head" (Matt 8:20) Hunger - "How I have longed to eat this Passover meal with you" (Luke 22:15) & "I thirst" (John 19:28) Grief - "Jesus wept" (John 11:35) Insult - "If the world hates you, realize that it hated me first" (John 15:18) In each of these bible verses, Jesus identifies with people suffering what the world calls 'deprivations'. Jesus reveals them not to be deprivations after all, but in fact, they are blessings. Jesus says, "you will weep and mourn, while the world rejoices.... but your grief will become joy!" (John 16:20) What makes these conditions blessed, after all, is the presence of Jesus in them with us. "I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world" (John 16:33). I imagine we have all been in the most severe and depriving of situations, but what made it tolerable or even welcome may have been WHO was with us through it. I can think of some of the toughest times that were redeemed by the best of company with me, experiencing it alongside me. Think of excruciating work done, tumultuous road trips or turned upside down expectations that became great memories because of the joyful company kept along the way. It was hard, but the company kept with us and transformed the time into something so memorable that we might even wish for it again! What makes the Beatitude conditions (poverty, hunger, grief and insult) blessed is the fact that Jesus is in them with us (He brings the blessing to it!) Maybe we can hear the Beatitudes in that new light – the light that overcomes the darkness, that is Jesus (John 1:5)!

In Jesus' Sermon on the Plain here, Luke 6:27-38 goes on to further reveal Jesus' resurrection ethic. Jesus' Way of transforming death to life, sin to grace and dark to light. He teaches us to 'love our enemies', 'give without strings' and 'refrain from condemnatory judging'. Jesus is revealing a positive method of life-giving affirmation that does not supply any energy to negative forces that diminish, destroy or divert us from human flourishing and fulfillment. This way of Jesus may not seem to come naturally to us (keep in mind that original sin had infected human nature with a corrupting selfish instinct). Yet, that is why we call it 'grace'. And it is what powers His 'resurrection' and 'eternal life'.

I like how the gospel of Luke records Jesus' beatitudes (four blessings and four woes rather than Matthew's straightforward eight beatitudes) as almost a teaching in a heaven/earth reversal format. Jesus is good at shocking us awake, by twists in our expectations, turning top to bottom, or bottom's up. Luke 13:30 has Jesus teaching, "Some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last." Also, Luke 22:26. He says, "Let the greatest among you be as the least, and the leader as the servant." Mary taught in her praise-prayer, that God "brings down rulers from their thrones, but lifts up the lowly" (Luke 1:52). Of course, too the parable of the rich man and Lazarus, graphically displays such a 'Reversal-Fulfillment' of the poor becoming rich and rich becoming poor. And the parable in Luke 16:25 records Abraham cautioning, "remember that you received what was good during your lifetime while Lazarus likewise received what was bad; but now he is comforted here, whereas you are tormented."

This is Jesus' Way: The Way of Life is the Way of His Cross! The Way of Peace is the Way of the Cross!
