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## *Pastor's Paragraphs*

*By Interim Pastor Doug Marshall*

At our February Session meeting we approved an Interim Plan. This includes a schedule of events that will help Puckety move through the interim time toward the next called pastor for this congregation. There are ways you can be part of this process and help as we search for Puckety's next pastor. If you are interested in any of these contact the person(s) coordinating it. Here are a few of the parts of this Interim Plan:

1) Demographic Study: Coordinated by Chuck West

Puckety Church is in Lower Burrell. What do we really know about who lives here and who our neighbors are? Everyone has assumptions, but what is the reality on the ground. This group will look at the government demographic information to see how many people are in our community and what their interests and needs are.

2) Community Interviews: Coordinated by Rebecca Fisher

The leaders of Lower Burrell probably know more about the needs of this community than we do. Let's learn from those in leadership positions in our community – business leaders, school leaders, community leaders, government leaders.

3) Congregational Systems Inventory: Coordinated by Doug Marshall

Every church functions like a family system, with certain rules and expectations.

There isn't a right or wrong way, but this survey will help us look at Puckety and see if there are changes that need to be made to how we do church. The message of God's love in Jesus Christ doesn't change. How we do church and carry out our message may need to change to match the world we live in today.

4) Focus Groups: Coordinated by Sophia Earhart, Mike Tatem, Matt Wehrle;

Led by Session Members

We want to give everyone a voice about the future of Puckety Church. Session is going to schedule a variety of listening meetings where you are invited to share your hopes and dreams for the future of Puckety Presbyterian Church.

5) Puckety Planning and Dreaming Event: Led by Doug Marshall – Sunday, May 6, from 10:00 am – 4:00 pm

This is the day we will pull together all the information gathered in the above events. We will hear the reports from each of the groups, make adjustments and final comments. The information that we have gathered will be used by the PNC (see below) to write the MIF (Ministry Information Form – a resume for the church) which will be looked at by pastors who might be interested in being candidates for becoming the next called pastor at Puckety.

6) Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC)

The PNC (you better get used to the abbreviations – they'll come at us often over the next several years) will be elected in April. This is the congregational committee (members of Puckety) that will have the job of seeking the next called pastor at Puckety. Please pray that God will show you if you are being called to be part of this group. It's a challenging, time-consuming and rewarding job that is a very important. Over the coming weeks and months please keep the PNC in your prayers, that God would lead them to the right person to become the next pastor at Puckety.

If anyone is interested in serving as part of the Fellowship and Care Team, please talk to Mike or Kim Tatem. The main New Testament word translated "fellowship" means, "partnership, close relationship, or communion". The goal of the team is to promote fellowship with God first, then believers at Puckety, other local believers, and Christians around the world. Our goal is for fellowship to be truly spiritual and practical. We believe that God wants everything that is done at Puckety (the body of believers, not the building) to promote fellowship with Him and other believers, to the glory of our Lord! Some of the things we are considering are: small groups, ways to get to know each other spiritually and personally at church meals and gatherings, connection with other local believers, and ministry of various kinds. If this is something you believe the Lord wants you to consider, please let us know.



## **PUCKETY CHOIR FAQ's – Everything you wanted to know!**



**When does the choir rehearse?** Most Thursdays September through May, from 7:00 to 8:15 pm, shorter or a bit longer depending on season. We do take a Christmas break.

**Can I miss sometimes?** Life happens! Certainly, just let someone know so we are not worried.

**How long is the choir season?** We sing at worship as a choir from mid-September until the third weekend of May. We also sing on Maundy Thursday and Christmas Eve.

**Are there auditions? I'm not a strong singer and I don't read music too well.** There are no auditions, as God has already called you to the choir, so it is no one's place to deter that! I can help you decide if your voice is in a higher or lower range if you are unsure. Safety in numbers! Most will try us out and stay on, but if you decide it's not for you, that's ok.

**Do I have to stay in the choir area during the entire worship?** If you wish to sit with your family after the anthem, we encourage you to do so. It's the best of both worlds!

**Is there a lot of new music to learn each season?** We have a good balance of former and new music. We have our favorites which we love and that allows us extra time to learn new music.

**Do I have to learn the notes on my own? I can't do that.** No, we go over each vocal part at rehearsal, note by note, and build the songs. Those that can "sight read" music are always a huge help for those learning the notes. You would be seated near someone who can help you.

**What about choir robes, sometimes you wear them and sometimes you don't?** Correct. We try to wear our robes for Communion Sundays and other special worship services, if it is not too warm. The robes can be warm for some of us so we are selective when we use them. Some Sundays we coordinate a color theme to underscore the liturgical season or the anthem.

**What happens if I have to miss practice. Can I still sing on Sunday?** There is no strict rule with missing rehearsals since we spend several weeks learning new music.

**Is this fun? I need fun and fellowship in my life.** Oh my yes! We do work hard, but we definitely have fun. We laugh, we pray, we sing, we share. All to glorify the Lord, and have our efforts be pleasing to Him. We enjoy a summer kick-off picnic, with a couple of pizza parties along the way too!

**What is "summer music" that is on the bulletin board?** During the choir hiatus from June-September, people can sign up to do something special musically at worship: instrumental or vocal, solo or a group.

**Ok, so how can I try it out to see if I can do this?** First pray about it, then contact Lorraine Menk, choir director, at 724-339-9531 = email [kirbie1@comcast.net](mailto:kirbie1@comcast.net), or talk to her at worship, or just let any choir member know you are coming. Check before you attend just to make sure we are meeting.

### **POWER OF PRAYER**



## “Tis the Season”



# Shipwrecked Vacation Bible School

**Who:** Children ages 3 years\*\* - 5<sup>th</sup> grade

**When:** Mon. June 18<sup>th</sup> - Fri. June 22<sup>nd</sup> from 6:00pm-8:45pm

***There are many different ways YOU can help, some before VBS, some during...some behind the scenes, some with the kids each night.***

***Either way, to make our VBS as successful as possible, we need YOUR help! Take a look at the opportunities to see where YOU can fit in:***

***Crew leaders:*** You are not responsible for teaching the VBS material in this role. They are responsible for taking a group of 5-8 children from station to station, talking with the children in your group, getting to know the kids and share God's love with them!

***Bible Story Station Supply Helpers:*** This two-person team will find, gather, whatever props and things are needed for the Bible Story Teller. This 2-person team would work with the Bible story teller, to ensure that supplies are ready each night. At least one of the two people in this team needs to stay and assist the Bible story teller each evening as the story is told to each crew.

***Station leaders:*** They stay in one place and are responsible for leading one particular thing. We need leaders for the following stations: Imagination Station (Science experiments and Crafts area), the Bible Discovery Station (where the Bible story is told to the children each evening), Snack Factory (the place where all kids and staff come to eat and fellowship), and the Game Makers station. If you are a station leader, all materials and lessons are provided!

***Station leader helpers:*** These people help a particular station leader each night of VBS and possibly help the leader gather/organize materials and prepare the activities for each night.

***Nursery Care:*** This 2-person group is responsible to care for any children (younger than 3 yrs. of age) whose parent is helping during VBS. This takes place in the cry room in the sanctuary.

***Head Decorator:*** This person would be the lead for all the decorating throughout the church and Faith Hall. They would gather other people to help them do the decorating. The Shipwrecked Decorating DVD and Group's website both provide pictures and offer suggestions for how to decorate various areas of the church. Some supplies are ordered and we have some things in the attic, but this person should have some water/shipwrecked ideas to add to what is purchased.

***Decorator:*** These people would work with the "head decorator" to transform the sanctuary and hallways into our shipwrecked theme as well as transforming the Bible Story room into the shore/jungle home for the week of Bible School. Some supplies are ordered and we have some things in the attic, but this person should have some water/shipwrecked ideas to add to what is purchased.

***Donation Board Manager:*** This one or two-person group is responsible to create the donation board, and manage the collection of all the items that come in so we know what still needs to be purchased and what we have. This is done prior to VBS starting and does not require you to be at VBS. (There is a template you can use and help is available if you'd like it!)

***The "Whatever is Needed" job:*** This one or two-person group is willing to show up the first two nights of VBS and is very willing to just be "around." They understand that they might be asked to serve as a crew leader, or maybe just asked to be a "runner" finding people, or relaying messages, or maybe not need to do a lot. This person or group is not out in front of people but is very important to have when those unexpected situations arise!

***The Greeter:*** This one or two-person person group is asked to welcome parents as they drop their child off for VBS and answer any questions they might have about where their child goes, or other VBS questions. This person should be very comfortable talking with people and their children and making them feel at home with us!

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## Stories of Redstone

### *Christ at work in our midst*

Countless studies have shown that we all learn in different ways. Some learn best by listening to a lecture, others need to interact and experiment with the material. Gardner's multiple intelligences theory lists 8 ways in which people learn: visual, musical, kinesthetic, interpersonal, logical, verbal, & intrapersonal. It stands to reason that if we learn in different ways, then we each probably connect with our faith in different ways too.



A great way to tap into this variation on worship is to set up "prayer stations." Stations can be tactile, reflective, creative, and simple. Many prayer station tracks will have a particular focus, such as a Biblical theme (Waiting; Fruits of the Spirit) or a Bible Story (Advent/Birth of Jesus; Holy Week.) You can find loads of station ideas to incorporate into your worship services or special prayer room on Pinterest, websites such as [engageworship.org](http://engageworship.org), [rethinkinyouthministry.com](http://rethinkinyouthministry.com), and in books like "Creative Prayer" by Faith McCloud. Check out our newest blog post at [redstonetogether.blogspot.com](http://redstonetogether.blogspot.com) to view station ideas (and pictures) that allow you to walk through the last week of Jesus' life here on earth, put together by Rev.
