DART TIPS FROM THE DARTBOARD SHOPPE

Many players complain that whenever they buy new darts, the first few days they have them, they get a lot more "bounce outs" than they are used to. They get very frustrated, even to the degree that they go back to their old darts. These actions can well be corrected with very little effort.

New darts bounce out of the board because of two reasons:

1. The dart is overly sharp.
2. The sides of the point are very smooth and shiny.

What happens with a sharp point is this. The dart actually sticks into the wire spider on the board and then bounces out. With a blunter dart, it will slide around the wire and enter the board. With reason #2, the sides are so slippery that the fibers in the board have nothing to grip when the dart hits them, so it just rebounds out. Luckily, the cure for both problems is simple. Just burr over the points of new darts very, very slightly. Roughen up the sides with emery paper or a dart sharpening stone.

Do not continually sharpen your darts. If you keep them to a needle point you are going to get a lot more bounce outs and, on top of this, you stand in danger of either getting a hook on the point or breaking it off altogether. You are better off just sharpening them enough to keep the point semi-sharp.
