Did You Know?

On the morning of June 4, 1942, Lt. Cmdr. John C. Waldron, a proud member of the Oneida Nation, led Torpedo Squadron 8 (VT-8) from the USS Hornet into the Battle of Midway. Flying outdated TBD Devastators, they faced an impossible task, slow, underdefended torpedo bombers against the best fighters and pilots in the Imperial Japanese Navy and the formidable Kido Butal.

Waldron knew the odds. Before takeoff, he told his men: "If there is only one plane left to make a final run, I want that man to go in and get a hit"

VT-8 found the Japanese fleet, but without fighter cover. All 15 of Waldron's aircraft were shot down. Only one man survived, Ens. George Gay, who watch the battle unfold while floating in the sea.

29 of the 30 men from VT-8 were KIA.

Though none of VT-8's torpedoes struck, their sacrifice drew Japanese fighters down to sea level, leaving the skies clear for the dive bombers that arrived moments later and turned the tide of the war.

John C. Waldron and the VT-8 didn't come home, but, they changed history.
