

 <u>Water Conservation Tips</u> <u>Inside</u> * Do run the dishwasher and washing machine only when full. Save even more by using the short cycle * Don't let the water run while washing dishes. Kitchen faucets use 2 to 3 gallons a minute. Filling a basin only takes 10 gallons to wash and rinse <u>Outside</u> * Don't allow sprinklers to water your street * Only water your lawn or plants before 9am or after 7pm * Place 3-4"layer of mulch around trees and plants to retain moisture to keep the soil cool <u>Bathroom</u> * Do take short shower and save 5 to 7 gallons a minute * Don't run the water while shaving, washing your hands or brushing your teeth. Faucets used 2 to 3 gallons a minute Everywhere * Do repair leaky faucets and turn taps off tightly. A slow drip wastes 15 to 20 gallons each day * Don't open fire hydrants 		The water project is nearing the end! 7-303 SAME; EXCEPTIONS; DISCHARGES. (a) Section 7-302 of this article shall not apply to the fire or discharge of fireworks within the <u>City between the hours of 8:00</u> <u>AM. and 11:00 PM. on June 27th through</u> <u>July 5th.</u>

(b) The governing body of the City may, in its discretion, grant permission at any time for the public display of fireworks by responsible individuals or organizations when such display or displays shall be of such a character and so located, discharged and fired as shall not be a fire hazard or endanger persons or surrounding property.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to give any public display of fireworks without having first obtained a permit thereof.

7-304. SAME; EXCEPTION; SALE OF FIREWORKS. Any person, firm, or corporation who or which has first obtained a valid permit to sell fireworks within the City may do so between the hours of 8:00 AM. and 11:00 P.M. commencing June 20th and through July 7th of each year.

7-305. APPROVED FIREWORKS; BOTTLE ROCKETS PROHIBITED. (a) All fireworks offered for sale and discharged within the city shall be of a type that has been tested and approved for sale and use within the state by the state fire marshal. (b) Bottle rockets and other similar self propelled firework or fireworks devices consisting of a tube and attached guiding stock or rod shall not be sold or discharged in the city. Notice the new sale dates in the Firework code! You can now purchase Fireworks in Moran from June 20th-July 7th, however the dates to discharge fireworks is still June 27th—July 5th from 8:00am—11:00pm.

The City would like to remind homeowners to mow your grass in a manner so that the grass is not blown out onto the roadway. Grass accumulation on the roadway can damage the structure of the roadbed as accumulated grass clippings hold water and blocks proper drainage, thereby causing subsequent road deterioration.



The Moran Police Departments encourages you to always remember your outdoor pets

Summertime humidity and high temperatures are just around the corner. These weather conditions require extra care for your outdoor pets.

- Never leave an animal in your vehicle, as temperatures inside a vehicle can reach well over 120 degrees in a matter of minutes.
