- An itemized agenda;
- An "Agenda Item Summary Report" for each agenda item, with background information on the agenda item and recommendations for any action that needs to be taken by council. Also, any supporting documents and information are attached to the Summary Report.

Thinking of Developing?

If you are thinking of developing on your property in the Summer Village, next summer, now is the time to start the application process. No development shall be undertaken in the Summer Village unless an application has been approved and a Development Permit has been issued

- ♦ Make sure you know exactly where your property line is.
- ◆ Apply for a development permit from the Summer Village, at least 3 weeks before you plan to proceed.
- Application forms are available on the Village website or from the administrator. A site plan showing dimensions and location of all buildings should be attached to the application.
- After your development permit is approved, make sure you have all the required permits, such as: building permit, electrical, plumbing, gas & sewer. These can be obtained from Superior Safety Codes: (1-886-999-4777)

Part 3.2 of the Land Use Bylaw lists developments that do not require a Development Permit.

Miscellaneous

Skating Rinks: Occasionally residents will clear a
patch of ice on the lake or a pond in their area for
a skating rink. For the safety of any skaters or
kids playing hockey, please keep snowmobiles off,
particularly the area between Homestead Trail
and Russel Drive.

2. Rec Center Maintenance

A big THANK YOU to Melanie Russell for taking care of the flowers at the Rec Center and also for taking care of the bottle recycling project. Also, thanks to Lloyd & Norrie Miller for keeping the rec center grass and grounds so nice. Even though the Rec Center isn't used much at this time, the park and playground are very popular in the summer.

3. Waste Disposal/Garbage Bins

The garbage bins in the Village are for <u>BAGGED</u> <u>HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE ONLY</u>. Any large items or construction materials can be taken to the land fill sites at Mallaig or Vincent Lake, RR 95. The bins are emptied every Wednesday and the village pays a flat fee to the County of St. Paul, regardless of the weight or amount of garbage.

<u>Idea for Christmas Morning Breakfast</u>

Easy Breakfast Casserole Recipe

This Easy Breakfast Casserole Recipe has hash browns, ham, cheese, and eggs. This hash brown breakfast casserole can be made overnight. Perfect for a holiday breakfast!

Prep Time	Cook Time	Total Time
5 mins	1 hr	1 hr 5 mins

Ingredients

- · 24 oz. frozen hash browns -about 8 cups
- 16 oz. cubed ham
- 8 oz. sharp cheddar cheese -shredded
- 12 large eggs
- 1 cup milk -I used skim
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- cooking spray

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- Add the frozen potatoes, ham, and cheese to a large bowl. Toss to combine. Pour the mixture into a 9 x 13 inch baking dish that has been sprayed with cooking spray.
- In a large bowl, whisk the eggs with the milk, salt, and pepper (I use the same bowl from step 1).
- Pour the egg mixture over the hash brown mixture. Pat everything down with the back of a wooden spoon.
- Bake for one hour, uncovered. The center should be set and the edges should be golden brown.
