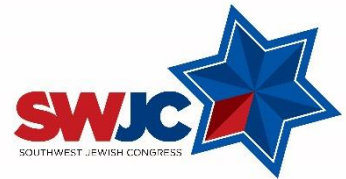
All guests will go through an airport-style security screening upon entering the Museum. Large bags and weapons are not allowed. See regulations on [Museum's website](#).

The *Kindertransport* (German for "children's transport") was an organized rescue effort that took place during the nine months prior to the outbreak of the Second World War. The United Kingdom took in nearly 10,000 predominantly Jewish children from Nazi Germany, Nazi-occupied Austria, Czechoslovakia and Poland, and the Free City of Danzig. The children were placed in British foster homes, hostels, schools and farms. Often they were the only members of their families who survived the Holocaust. [DOWNLOAD FLYER](#)
