

MCCoA to Install Automated Check-in System MCCoA will be rolling out a new, automated check-in system called MySeniorCenter. It is specifically designed to help our staff members manage the various sign-ups, sign-ins, and improve the way we report our services to various agencies. Because we will be able to quickly and accurately detail the services we provide, the system will increase our chances of receiving additional funding in the future. Also, it will greatly improve the efficiency of work flow for staff. MySeniorCenter is used by over 900 senior centers across the United States and Canada with much success.

MySeniorCenter is extremely easy to use. All visitors and volunteers will receive a small keytag (similar to a Kroger card). The card does not contain any personal information, but it will allow the new system to recognize you when the card is swiped at the keytag scanner. You will then be able to indicate which activity you plan to participate in on the supplementary touchscreen computer.

Even though MySeniorCenter is designed to be user-friendly, MCCoA staff will be available to help operate the new check-in system. We want to make the transition as seamless as possible for everyone, so we will be here for you every step of the way! MCCoA is targeting a roll out date at the end of April 2019. Keep vour eves and ears open for additional information as it becomes available.


