LIVING IN THE LIGHT

¹³ "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

¹⁴ "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. ¹⁵ Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

Matthew 5:13-16

As part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, Jesus shares these verses with his audience. Jesus reminds us that every good thing created for the blessing of this life can be used also as weapons in this life. Salt is good, but if salt loses its saltiness, how can it be good? A light is good, but a hidden light is not good. What good is a light that shines in a closed, dark, box? What would happen if we constantly had the focus of using salt as it was intended to be used? What would happen if our focus was to continue to bring light to illuminate the darkness around us?

We live in a world where technology and innovation continue to advance. I don't know about you, but sometimes I sit and think of my grandparents cooking on a wood-burning stove. I think of my mom trying to describe that my dad was going to send me a piece of paper on the telephone (fax machine). I sometimes think back on that day and that conversation and realize a fax machine was birthed and died in about 10 years. I remember not purchasing a video camera in the mid 1990's because the means of storing the pictures was changing to a 3.5 disc that one could pop into their computer. When we went to purchase the 3.5-disc camera, we learned about the new cameras with a SD card that would hold so much more data than the 3.5 disc we about to be released. We postponed our purchase, again. Time and time again, we let the plan of purchasing a video camera be blown out by the salesperson.

One thing is for sure, Jesus's light in us is not to be blown out. His light is not to be put-off for something newer and better, either. Jesus's light is to be burning bright and obvious in each of us. As we enter Lent, we are to let our lights shine, so that all the world comes to know the Savior of the world, Jesus!

Congregational Council Minutes December 2023

ATTENDANCE: Absent – None. Also in attendance were newly elected Council members Sherwood Garrett, Jennifer Miller, Jerry Price, Terry Swygert, and Connor Eargle.

CARES AND CONCERNS: Kristy Bowman, daughter of Jeannette Biley, friend of Cyndi Leaphart, passed away; Jennifer Miller's sister, Samantha, who is to be induced on December 26; thanks to all the carolers who sang and brought joy to shut-in members; Melanie Jackson is feeling better following a bout with Covid.

MEMBER CARE:

ADOPTION OF AGENDA: Accepted as presented.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES: Minutes for November 2023 and the Annual Meeting were accepted as presented.

REPORTS:

- Pastor Gina: Report for December 2023 was submitted.
- Treasurer: Budget Report for November 2023 and Treasurer's Report for November 2023 were submitted.
- Financial Secretary: Funds Report for November 2023 was submitted.
- Executive Committee: The Executive Committee changed the name of the Special Service Offering line item to Habitat for Humanity. The Executive Committee recommends that the Easter Offering and the Christmas Offering line items be moved to the Habitat for Humanity line item. **PASSED** unanimously.

Team Reports/Recommendations:

Team for Ministry:

Care: Written report submitted. Outreach: No report submitted.

Support: Written report submitted. The Support Team recommends that we use Taylor Rentals (Neal Taylor, owner) to remove existing boxwoods and all roots from this removal and the prior shrubbery removal in front of the church and Education Building, haul away all roots, boxwoods, and the concrete cylinders used for edging. The cost is estimated to be \$3,300 with \$2,000 to come from loan proceeds and \$1,300 from the landscaping donation. **PASSED** unanimously. The Support Team recommends that we use One 12 Landscaping to place cloth weed barrier and plants, and place pine straw in front of the church and Education Building. The cost is not to exceed \$8,700 with funds coming from the landscaping donation. The total for both recommendations is not to exceed \$12,000. **PASSED** unanimously.


The Teach Team continues to work on the education component of our discipleship. Shrove Tuesday will include a teaching surrounding Shrove Tuesday.


