With this approval, bids to replace and restore the Octagon House roof and chimney tops can be advertised and the most compatible bid chosen. This step is the first and most significant. Not only will it ensure a dry environment but will also be "something to see." Everyone wants to see where their support, our volunteers hard work, and the financial support from both the private and public sectors will be used. Without this support, we would not have been able to reach this goal. So, let's celebrate and begin this new journey together, helping this landmark become a window to this region's past, an inflection of who we are today, and a teaching tool for the future.

Many may ask the meaning of the previous statement. When the Foundation was formed, the singular purpose was to save and preserve this community landmark. As we have progressed, our mission has expanded to become more inclusive of what this building represents to all individuals. History is often viewed and experienced individually. We intend to provide an experience for all, whether as a rare architectural landmark and historical experience, an educational and cultural center, or a beautiful event venue that would not be found anywhere else.

In the meantime, and though construction should begin soon, we must continue in our efforts to raise funds. We are now bound to a limited time schedule if the project is to receive historic preservation tax-credits. Within five years, the project must be completed. FIVE YEARS.....this sounds like a long period of time. However, in the process of authentic restoration, this is a small amount of time as attention to detail is a must and multiple phases should be working at

once. These include the roof, to the sub-structure, to planting of garden spaces.....we cannot rest!
